

The most overlooked chapter officer...

Dear Brothers:

"Well," said the Chapter President, "we need to make a decision about our fundraiser."

"Let's do something new this year; something that will make us lots of money," said the Vice President for Finance.

The Treasurer agreed. "We certainly need it to pay for our banquet. But remember, last year we almost lost our shirt on our fund raising project."

"We must be careful," agreed the President, "but my Big Brother told me how easy it was to raise all that money three years ago. But that was before my time."

The Treasurer added, "That's mentioned in our old ledgers and files but not very much."

"I remember hearing about that, too," the Vice President for Finance said, "but wasn't there a problem with the Dean's Office because we were selling on campus? And I thought we needed a permit from the city?"

"Well," said the President, "we better check this out some more so we don't reinvent the wheel. Who can we ask about this?" Who can they ask indeed.

Many chapters face these same or similar circumstances everyday but aren't sure who to turn to. Their District Director? The Regional Director? Call The Central Office? Any or all are possibilities but the answer may be closer to home than they realize. The one chapter officer who may

have all the answers often times is thought of the least, and overlooked the most. Your Chapter Advisor.

Most of our chapters have an annual turnover rate of 25 percent to 50 percent. Often it is the faculty or alumni advisor who provides the continuity necessary to provide a direct link between yesterday, today, and tomorrow, thereby making it unnecessary to reinvent the wheel on a continuing basis.

Our collegiate Brothers desire and need strong support as they participate in the many experiences that lead them to their places in the business community. Many chapters are fortunate enough to have both faculty members and alumni involved as advisors. Faculty and alumni who choose to become involved with a collegiate chapter provide a bridging network which helps to contribute to the success of the chapter.

While an Advisor's role is significant, it is also one of the most difficult within our fraternity. The Advisor's effectiveness is directly related to his or her direct contact with the chapter. Keeping in contact means effective communication in both directions - chapter to Advisor and Advisor to chapter. Everyone must be informed if there is to be any semblance of a closed communication loop.

Advisors should be visible at chapter functions and attend chapter meetings - executive as well as general - in order to be informed of the true state of the chapter, its strengths, and its needs. This visibility promotes credibility and shows that the Advisor wants to be more than a figurehead.

Yes, an Advisor is much more than the title suggests. He or she must be a good listener, a mediator, a mentor, a counselor, and a friend in times of distress or

uncertainty.. At times it may be best to say nothing, while other times may demand full involvement in every aspect of planning and implementation. On occasion, the Advisor may have to be a dictator, especially if there is potential for violation of fraternity, university, or community laws.

Many chapters make effective and frequent use of their Advisors. Many others, though, do not involve their Advisors in chapter matters; do not seek their counsel; do not try to get them involved; and on occasion, just ignore them. No wonder that some Advisors do not participate or feel welcome.

So what does one get out of being an Advisor? The tangible kudos are few, but the intrinsic rewards are endless. Just knowing you are appreciated and have had a hand in helping others help themselves can be enough. The only reward that one should expect is for the chapter to utter that magic phrase "THANK YOU" on a regular basis.

To all our collegiate Chapter Advisors, past and present, we say "THANK YOU" for a job well done. Your efforts and dedication are deeply appreciated.




PRESCOTT H. ASHE, a graduate of the University of California at Berkeley and an alumnus of Rho Chapter, has been chosen Collegian of the Year for 1990. A business administration major, Prescott maintained a 3.9 cumulative grade point average during his four years at California-Berkeley, with a 4.0 grade point average within his

major. Initiated on November 16, 1985, by Rho Chapter, Prescott is a Life Member contributor to the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund. While a collegiate member of Rho Chapter, he served as President, Chancellor and Alumni Relations Chair. Further, he served as the Rho Chapter delegate to the 37th Grand Chapter Congress in St. Louis, Missouri.

In addition to working with Rho Chapter, Prescott participated in the formation of the Undergraduate Business School Senate and was a member of the Undergraduate Finance Association. Named to Phi Beta Kappa in his junior year, Prescott is a candidate for the California-Berkeley University Medal; the University's highest award to be received by only one graduating senior.

While at California-Berkeley, Prescott was awarded the California Association of Realtors Scholarship, the California Mortgage Bankers Association Scholarship, the Deloitte, Haskins and Sells Managers and Staff Award, and Deans honors in each of the last seven semesters.

During his college years, Prescott was employed by the Liquidity Fund Investment Corporation as a Financial Analyst and by Price Waterhouse as an Audit

qualities for which the Collegian of the Year was established.

Each chapter in the fraternity has the opportunity to nominate a member for this award. From all regional nominees, a regional finalist is selected by a screening committee within the region and, from these finalists, a national winner is chosen by the Executive Committee of Delta Sigma Pi. Established in 1971, this award recognizes the outstanding collegiate member of the fraternity as evidenced by scholarship, extra-curricular activities, fraternity services, demonstration of responsibility to self and others and representation of conduct according to the highest standards of business ethics and integrity.

DAVID J. SCHULTZ is the Collegian of the Year nominee from the Eastern Region. A member of the Alpha Kappa Chapter at the State University of New York at Buffalo, David was a masters candidate and maintained a 3.7 grade point

Intern. Through his employment and scholarships, Prescott was able to finance fifty percent of his undergraduate education.

A licensed California Real Estate salesperson and a certified private pilot, Prescott also enjoys reading, skiing and weight lifting. 



In 1989, the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund introduced to our Brotherhood their Annual Campaign program. This new fund raising program represented one of the most important developments in the history of our Fraternity. The Leadership Fund, a separate legal entity, has built a special "partnership" with the Fraternity and the Educational Foundation in order to provide the "best of both worlds" to those who wish to support the charitable aims and ideals of Delta Sigma Pi.

Through the inaugural 1989-90 Annual Campaign, the Leadership Fund has raised in excess of \$100,000 from over 2,500 Brothers and friends of Delta Sigma Pi. 
SOUTH DAKOTA, ALPHA ETA—






Headquarters Headlines


