
Over 650 Deltasigs gather in Anaheim, California to experience the magic of brotherhood and professionalism

Brilliant sun, sparkling sand and over 650 Deltasigs from all parts of the United States and beyond provided the perfect ingredients for the 39th Grand Chapter Congress of Delta Sigma Pi. The Anaheim Marriott Hotel hosted "Experience the Magic of Brotherhood" August 1-22, 1993, which was a great opportunity for Deltasigs to learn more about their fraternity; to develop personal and professional skills, and to meet many new friends and visit with friends from many years ago.

Before the convention itself began, the first of five 1993 Officer Training Schools was conducted. Nearly 200 collegiate chapter officers took part in this intensive one day program that covered the gamut of chapter operations. Each participant could choose from a multitude of topics to design a program best suited to their individual and chapter needs.

At the conclusion of the Officer Training School, some 250 Deltasigs, their friends and family members gathered at Corona del Mar State Beach for the California Beach Bash. For many participants, it was their first chance to see the Pacific Ocean and the level of excitement was high. Volleyball was popular as well as other beach games. As a picture postcard perfect day gave way to a stunning sunset, dinner was served and numerous bonfires were started in the fire rings. It was a beautiful evening that provided many memories for all in attendance.

On Wednesday, many more participants arrived and those

That evening, the Grand President's Reception and Opening Dance were held. In addition to meeting volunteer and staff leaders, the participants had a chance to get to know each other and to share some great social time before the business of the Congress began.

On Thursday, August 19, 1993, the day began early with the Keynote Address by Christina U. Lewis, Director of the Speakers Bureau of the National Association of Persons with AIDS. The Opening Business Session began after the Keynote



A few days ago, I received a telephone call from an individual who had just been depledged by the chapter at his university. After we got through the various emotional reactions — anger, frustration, hurt, etc., — it became apparent that the primary problem was a lack of communication and simple interpersonal skills. The unspoken desire of this caller was for me to contact the President of the chapter and to tell them that they were wrong. It's very difficult and, frankly, improper to judge a situation when only one side of the equation is presented. I chose not to ignore the caller but to assure him that the matter would be explored and that he would, in some way, receive more concrete evidence of why he was removed from the pledge program.

Upon further investigation, it was revealed that this person was not told the real reasons for his termination from the program. He was euphemistically told that his removal was for the good of himself and the chapter. In actuality, it seems that there were strong personality conflicts that were unresolved.

This episode, while not the norm in our chapters, certainly is not uncommon. It illustrates an important aspect of the opera-

tions of our chapters and our entire Fraternity — interpersonal dynamics. Perhaps your fellow chapter members, your business associates or you might need to concentrate greater energy in dealing with this lifetime challenge.

We are an association of people primarily with similar academic interests. The simple fact that we bring people together also entails that we must effectively work with a diversity of ideas, opinions and personalities. Our business is people and it is important that we are tuned into working with people in an effective and an honest manner.

Before joining the staff of Delta Sigma Pi, the fraternity was my primary source of volunteer activity. Now as a staff member, I devote my volunteer efforts toward other organizations. In one of these organizations, I serve on a committee of ten and we have a problem. While we all bring a diversity of values and ideas to our committee work, we are usually able to reach decisions that are palatable to all committee members — except one.

This one committee member is usually the first among us to shoot down new ideas. Myself and others have observed him shaking his head negatively before we even have a chance to

finish articulating an idea or a suggestion. In many instances, committee votes are 9 to 1.

A reaction of several committee members has been to ostracize this person. Some people are uncomfortable when he is around and are genuinely glad when he is absent from meetings.

Fortunately, a few committee members have taken the time and the interest to sit down with this person to express their feelings toward him. They have simply told him that his body language is full of negativism and that people feel that there are issues that they are not comfortable discussing around him. They have made it clear to him that he has a right to his opinions but his lack of respect for the opinions of others generally results in a similar treatment of virtually all of his views.

It's too early to evaluate his reaction to this input because it has been given in recent days. I suspect that he is somewhat hurt and angry. He probably has thought about quitting this voluntary involvement. Hopefully, after some thought, he will continue his efforts and his contributions, but will temper them with greater sensitivity toward the views of others. In this instance, the problem has not been so much his message

but his method of delivery.

Barriers to positive communication and interpersonal dynamics are easy to build but very difficult to break down. Working with people is a complex task and we all make mistakes. The biggest mistake that any of us can make, though, is to not even begin to attack problems in this important area.

While unity is important to the success of any organization, it doesn't mean that everyone in the group must agree or have the same opinion. It's the blending of a diversity of ideas in a positive way that makes an organization strong and gives its members a sense of ownership and loyalty.

So take some time to evaluate not only your own "people skills" but the "people skills" in your workplace and in other organizations. Chances are that you, like me, will find that they need some attention. Developing skills in this area is a lifelong challenge, but life is much easier when you pay attention to how you relate to others.

Biennial Leaders Elected

Delta Sigma Pi welcomes its newly elected Board of Directors and Executive Committee members

The Final Business Session of each Grand Chapter Congress is devoted to the election of the Board of Directors who will lead Delta Sigma Pi for the subsequent biennium. The elections conducted during the 39th Grand Chapter Congress in Anaheim, California filled the positions of Grand President, Vice President for Alumni Benefits and Services, Provincial Vice Presidents and Regional Directors. In all, eighteen Regional Directors, four Provincial Vice Presidents, one Vice President for Alumni Benefits and Services and one Grand President, were elected to serve for the 1993-95 biennium. In addition, by fraternity law, the Past Grand President and the Collegians of the Year 1992 and 1993 assumed positions on both the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of Delta Sigma Pi.

Clark, Director of Alumni Development Daniel S. Doyle, Director of Educational Services C. Dean Ferguson, Director of Administrative Services Robby L. Hultz and Chapter Consultants Kathleen S. Dinius, James E. Leingang and Carla S. May.

Dale M. Clark introduced the colonies in attendance at the convention including: University of Nebraska at Omaha, Kennesaw State College from Marietta, Georgia, the University of California at Santa Barbara and Roger Williams University from Bristol, Rhode Island. He also recognized the representatives from schools interested in forming colonies of Delta Sigma Pi including, Salve Regina University from Newport, Rhode Island and Whittier College from Whittier, California. The Roll Call of delegates to the 39th Grand Chapter Congress was then called.

Presentations were also made by professional speakers on the topics of sexual harassment, the job search and alcohol abuse. Many of the speakers were possible through a grant from the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation. On Friday evening, the candidates for the Board of Directors had an opportunity to meet with the delegates in formal sessions.

Saturday, August 21, 1993, was the final convention day and it provided a wide variety of activities. The Final Business Session was the first event of the day. The 1993-1995 Board of Directors was elected, and resolutions, recommendations and testimonials were considered. Past Grand President John V. Henik installed the new Board of Directors and the 39th Grand Chapter Congress was adjourned by newly elected Grand President Randy L. Hultz. After lunch, participants were treated to a special event, a fraternity history show conducted in a talk show format. Past Grand President and Delta

Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation Chairman & President Michael R. Mallonee served as emcee, Johnny Carson style, and was ably assisted by C. Dean Ferguson. He hosted Golden Council members R. Nelson Mitchell, Buzz Sutton, Frank Busch, Marilyn Franson and Mike Mazur. The pace was lively and the program included an excerpt from an interview with Founder Harold V. Jacobs, memories of all the guests as well as some audience members like Tony Fernandez, Bob Hughes and Warren Armstrong, and even an appearance by "Cognac the Incurable."


Later that afternoon, the Initiation of the 25th National Honorary Member of Delta Sigma Pi was conducted. Led



During the 39th Grand Chapter Congress, the Delta Sigma Pi Educational Foundation and the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Fund both approved a resolution calling for their merger into a single charitable entity. The Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation, the successor entity, continues the tradition of support for our fraternity and its members.

With over \$300,000 in endowment funds, \$500,000 in secured planned gifts, and successful annual campaigns, the Leadership Foundation each year provides our fraternity with grants for its various educational programs, and scholarships to our members for academic achievement.

The Board of Trustees of the Foundation also approved funding for four additional undergraduate scholarships for Deltasigs, bringing the total number of scholarships issued by the Foundation to 42. A listing of last year's scholarship recipients is contained in the Annual Report of the Foundation (see page 10).

Two additional giving levels of recognition were created by the Foundation during the annual meeting of the Trustees. Beginning with this year's campaign, the Foundation will recognize with a named scholarship those Brothers who have contributed \$25,000 or more during their lifetime. The Leadership Foundation will also provide recognition to Brothers who contribute \$500.00 or more annually with membership in the Patron's Circle of Donors. This new annual giving recognition carries with it many special benefits for its members.

Your Foundation Dollars at Work

During their August Annual Meeting at the 39th Grand Chapter Congress in Anaheim, California, the Board of Trustees of the Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation authorized four additional scholarships for undergraduate Deltasigs.

This increase, added to others, brings the total scholarship offering by our Foundation to 42 (which now includes eight Undergraduate and four Graduate grants). Additional grants are made available to each winner of the Regional Collegian of the Year Award (COY), the national COY, and select individual collegiate chapters.

Although the number of scholarships offered to members of Delta Sigma Pi has increased 45% since 1991 through the efforts of our Leadership Foundation, applications still outpace grants by ten to one. This fact points to the continued need for additional scholarship assistance for our members.

Individual unrestricted annual contributions to the Annual Campaign of the Leadership Foundation ensure that we are able to continue to meet the increasing scholarship assistance needs of our collegiate members.

Applications for the various scholarships offered by the Leadership Foundation may be obtained by either calling or writing The Central Office. General Undergraduate and Graduate scholarships are issued on the basis of scholastic achievement, fraternity involvement, campus and community service, and demonstrated financial need.

The Delta Sigma Pi Leadership Foundation welcomes all applications from members of our fraternity, and appreciates all contributions in support of this and the other important programs which benefit Delta Sigma Pi and its members.

The Leadership Foundation was also honored to have provided 100% of the funding needed for six seminar presentations at this year's Grand Chapter Congress.

During the convention (August 17-21, 1993), the Leadership Foundation provided funding for seminar presentations on hazing, AIDS, responsible drinking, job searches, sexual harassment, and ethics.

Ms. Eileen Stevens of C.H.U.C.K. (the Committee to Halt Useless College Killings) made three full days worth of presentations to Deltasigs on her son's hazing death during pledgship to a fraternity. Her powerful presentation was supplemented by a 16-page Leadership Foundation funded booklet entitled "Death by Hazing." Reprints of this booklet, which was distributed to every chapter present at Congress, are available from the office of the Leadership Foundation.

Ms. Christina Lewis, National Speakers Bureau Coordinator for NAPWA (the National Association for People with AIDS), is a Brother from our Theta Phi Chapter at the University of South Florida who is HIV positive. Her Keynote Address and seminar sessions on AIDS and HIV disease were well received by our members.

The Leadership Foundation also played a vital role in bringing to our convention a representative of Anheuser-Busch for a seminar entitled "Know When to Say When," a professional placement service representative for "Finding Your First Job," a Deltasig lawyer for a seminar on sexual harassment, and a Brother in Delta Sigma Pi who moderated a presentation on personal and professional ethics.
