Everyone has leadership, but it must be developed and EXERCISED! "Exercise Your Leadership" will challenge individuals to develop their leadership by modeling leadership standards for others to follow, demonstrating ethical respect, and developing a strong character to have the MUSCLE they need to be resilient leaders.

DeMoine Adams is originally from Pine Bluff, Arkansas and is a former University of Nebraska standout football player. DeMoine played an instrumental role in helping the Huskers win a Big 12 Conference Championship in 1999 and helped lead the Huskers to

the National Championship Rose Bowl in January 2002. He also spent time in the NFL with the Green Bay Packers, Tennessee Titans, and San Francisco 49ners. As a first generation student,

DeMoine received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Nebraska in Political Science with minors in English, History, Communications, Ethnic Studies and African Studies. He went on to receive his Master's degree in Educational Psychology and is currently pursuing his Doctorate degree at the University of Nebraska.

DeMoine is currently serving as the CEO for TeamMates Mentoring which was started by co-founders Tom and Nancy Osborne in 1991. DeMoine currently resides in Lincoln, Nebraska and spends his time on the side as a Motivational Speaker. He speaks numerous times each year across the country motivating others to be winners in life through his business called 'The Game Plan – Ready, Set, Perform' which he started in 2011. DeMoine's motto in life is: "Once you see where you're going, then everything you do must correspond with where you're going."

All You Need to Know About the New Individual Discipline Policy (CO) with Stephen Dominy and Chelsey Fix

In August 2021, the Fraternity Board of Directors approved an update to the Fraternity's Individual Discipline Policy (IDP). This new policy is set to be implemented starting July 1, 2023. The updated policy can be found highlighted in the National Policy and Procedures Manual (Discipline of the Individual).

In this session, the National Standards Committee will share an overview of the upcoming process, drafts of resources and trainings that will be available, and answer questions about the policy and/or processes.

Remember, this new policy doesn't go into effect until July! So we will also take some time to discuss finishing up your academic year while utilizing the current policy.

Defensive Leadership (LD) with DeMoine Adams
