NAME AND OBJECT OF THE FRATERNITY

Pi Delta Sigma is a fraternity organized to stimulate a greater interest in business among students; to bring about closer contact between students and faculty; to have discussions and associations with professional men of the business world; to encourage a higher standard of scholarship and business ethics; and to promote a closer affiliation between the students and faculty of the Business School.

HISTORY OF PI DELTA SIGMA

Pi Delta Sigma is an outgrowth of the Business-Accounting Society of the School of Business, Baylor University. The beginning of the organization dates back to 1927, when a club was organized among the students of business with an idea toward promoting a spirit of fellowship and at the same time presenting some worthwhile subjects to the students. There was little activity in the club during 1928, but there was still an urge felt among the students to have some sort of organization in the School of Business.

The following year, 1929, there was organized the Business Society which held to the ideal of the of the old club and attempted to make the club meetings worth while by presenting at their by-weekly meetings some Waco business man, who gave the practical business like talk which so well coordinated with the theory of the class room to give a well balanced knowledge. This club had about twenty active members and so promoted the idea of a club or society in the Business School, that the year 1930 saw a club organized under the name of the Business Accounting Society with thirty five students as members and three faculty members. The Society held bi-weekly meetings and discussed

the matters which would further the School of Business and the organization on the campus. Our attention was drawn to the possibility of securing a chapter of a national fraternity. Interest became high and for the last six months the members of the Business-Accounting Society have been considering and discussing the advisability, benefits, obligations and all other aspects of a National Business Fraternity. In this connection the members advised with the faculty of the University, business men and others who have had experience with such organizations.

Mr. L. L. Doughton, a member of Delta Sigma Pi, spoke to the Society several times concerning the fraternity idea and highly recommended the ideals and purposes of Delta Sigma Pi, explaining the benefits and the obligations of membership in that fraternity. After very thorough investigation the fraternity of Pi Delta Sigma was organized from the membership of the Business-Accounting Society with the intention of petitioning the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi.

The spirit and enthusiasm with which the members of the local fraternity displayed in an effort to make it a real organization seems to justify the sending of this petition.



Preamble

A fraternity composed of students in Business Administration and Industrial Management who have been organized to stimulate a greater interest in business among students; to bring about a closer contact between students and faculty; to have discussions and associations with professional men of the business world; to encourage a higher standard of scholarship and to promote a closer affiliation between students of the Business School.

Article I.

Name: This fraternity shall be officially known and designated as the PI DELTA SIGMA FRATERNITY.

Article II.

Object: The objects of this organization shall be to unite in fraternal bonds the business students of Baylor University; and to promote a mutual interest among its members in the ethical study and practice of business.

Article III.

Sec. 1. Membership of this organization shall be classified as active, alumni, and faculty.

Sec. 2. Candidates for membership must be male students taking major work in Baylor University School of Business; shall have attained the rank of sophomores prior to initiation; shall have at least nine majors, two of which must be in the School of Business; shall have an average grade of B in all work completed in the School of Business; shall be of good moral character; shall be of the Caucasian race; and shall show promise of future usefulness.

Sec. 3. Names of candidates selected according to sec. 2 shall be presented at a regular meeting and passed upon by a three-fourths majority of those members present.

Sec. 4. There shall be no inactive members of this organization.

Article IV.

Officers.

Sec. 1. The officers of this fraternity shall be; a President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Sec. 2. The duties of the President shall be to preside at the meetings and to be the executive head of the fraternity.

The duties of the Vice President shall be to preside at the meetings in absence of the president and to be the executive head of the personnel.

The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep the minutes of the meetings and other records of the fraternity.

The duties of the Treasurer shall be to collect all fees, dues, and assessments for the fraternity, to have charge of those collected and to disburse these upon written authority of the president.

Article V.

Sec. 1. Meetings shall be held every two weeks, beginning with the first Monday night of the school year. These meetings shall be called to order promptly at a designated time by the president. Special meetings shall be called at any time by the president on request of at least three active members of the organization. Notice of these meetings shall be duly sent to each member by the Secretary through the mail or in person.

Sec. 2. Three-fourths of the active membership shall constitute a quorum at all meetings.

Article VI.

Any proposed changes or amendments to this constitution shall be presented in written form at a regular meeting of this organization. Said proposed changes or amendments are to be voted on at a subsequent regular meeting. A three-fourths majority of all members present constituting a quorum shall be required to change or amend this constitution.

HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

The Baylor University School of Business was established by the Trustees in 1923.

The purpose was to provide culture and practical training for students who do not intend to become preachers, teachers, lawyers, physicians, dentists, or engineers; but who look forward to entering some field of business.

The School is composed of the Departments^{of} Economics, Business Administration, Accounting, and Secretarial Studies.

To enter the School of Business students must meet the same requirements as for admission to the College of Arts and Sciences.

The School grants only one degree, the Bachelor of Business Administration.

The work for Freshmen and Sophomores is as follows: English, 3 majors; History, 1 major; Mathematics, 1 major; Foreign Language, 2, 3, or 4 majors; Natural Science, 2 majors; Political Science or Sociology, 1 major; Economics, 2 majors; Business Administration, 1 major; Accounting, 1 major; Bible, 1 major.

For the B. B. A. Degree students are required to take at least 3 additional majors in Economics, 3 additional

majors in Business Administration, and 3 additional majors in accounting. They are required also to both major and minor in the School of Business, which will mean a total of 8 majors in one of the Departments and 5 in another.

The Economics required of all students for B. B. A. Degree is an Introductory Course, Principles of Economics, Money and Banking, Business Finance, and Business Cycles and Forecasting. In Business Administration the students must take an Introductory Course, Business Organization, Business Psychology, and Business Law. And the student must take in Accounting an Introductory Course, Principles of Accounting, and two other majors which the student may elect.

Some credit is given for work done out in the business world under the direction of a recognized public accounting firm, thus giving the student some experience in the business world.

Our course in Salesmanship requires some knowledge of Psychology, the study of the Principles of Salesmanship, and some experience in selling either in some business establishment or in canvassing from house-to-house or business-to-business.


We have in the School of Business approximately 300 students. The exact number cannot be stated because they take some of their work in the College of Arts classes, and may

not fully decide to seek the B. B. A. Degree before the beginning of their Junior work.

The first graduating class, in 1925, was composed of 7 students. In 1926 there were 13 who received the B. B. A. Degree. In 1927 there were 28 who received the Degree. In 1928 there were 32 who received the Degree. And in 1929 there were 39 who received the B. B. A. Degree.

For the year 1929-30 we had four full-time teachers, two assistant teachers. For the year 1930-31 we are to have five full-time teachers, all of whom hold Masters Degree of some sort, and some of them are in sight of their Doctor's Degree for which they have been working.

The School of Business students have the use of the General Library which contains more than 60,000 bound volumes, and we have in the School of Business Building the beginning of a separate Library which consists of 750 volumes at the present time.



HISTORY
of
BAYLOR UNIVERSITY

Baylor University, chartered under the laws of the Republic of Texas, owes its foundation to a movement begun by the Texas Union Baptist Association, which in 1842 resolved to found in Texas a Baptist University. Among the leaders of this movement were Rev. William M. Tyron, Rev. James Huckins, and Hon. R. E. B. Baylor, who together with others, organized themselves into a body known as the Texas Baptist Education Society.

The charter for the University was obtained from the Republic of Texas, February, 1845; the preparatory department with Professor Henry Gillette as principal, was opened the same year at the town of Independence, and in 1847 Rev. Henry L. Graves, D.D., LL.D. was elected president of the then flourishing school.

In 1848 the institution was placed under the control of the Baptist State Convention, which was organized in that year, and Dr. Graves retained as president. In 1851 Dr. Graves was succeeded in the presidency by Rev. Rufus C. Burlison, D.D., LL.D., and the University entered upon a season of prosperity, adding in that year a Department of Law, a large number of whose graduates became distinguished

in legal affairs of the State. This department, however, was abandoned after a few years.

In 1861, Dr. Burleson having resigned, Dr. George W. Baines, Sr., served as president for one year, and was succeeded by Rev. William Carey Crane, D.D., who served for twenty three years and was succeeded by Dr. Reddin Andrews.

Meanwhile, in the same year of his resignation as president of Baylor University at Independence President Burleson, having removed to Waco, established Waco University, under direction of the Trinity River Association. In 1868 this association having been merged into the Baptist General Association, Waco University passed under the control of this new organization. Waco University was the first coeducational institution in the South, the second in the United States, and third in the world.

In 1886 the situation with regard to Baptist education in Texas was as follows. Waco University, under the direction of the General Association was a flourishing university, while Baylor University at Independence, under the direction of the Baptist State Convention, was in a state of decline. The results was that Baylor University at Independence and Waco University were united under the name of Baylor University at Waco, and the two general organizations of the den-

omination having been consolidated under the name of "The Baptist General Convention of Texas", Baylor University was placed, and has since remained, under the control of this body.

In 1903 the Board of Trustees of Baylor University took over the School of Medicine, which had been organized at Dallas in 1900, and was known as the Medical Department of the University of Dallas. That institution is now the Baylor University College of Medicine and is an integral and coordinate part of the University. It has grown from year to year and now is rated as Class A by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals and by the Association of American Medical Colleges.

The School of Pharmacy was organized in 1904. It is located on the grounds of the Baylor Hospital in the greater medical center of Dallas, close to the Baylor College of Medicine. The College holds membership in the American Conference of Pharmaceutical Faculties, the object of which is to promote the interests of pharmaceutical education. The College is also registered in the New York Department of Education and in all other States that maintain registration bureaus.

In 1918 the building formerly occupied by the Medical College of Southern Methodist University in Dallas was purchased by the trustees of Baylor University to be used for a College of Dentistry. The government of the United States recognized this institution as a training school for dental officers in the army.

In November, 1920, the Texas Baptist Memorial Sanitarium and the College of Medicine were combined under one charter and one Board of Trustees. By the arrangement completed during the session of 1921-22, the Texas Baptist Memorial Sanitarium became the Baylor University Hospital, and the former Training School for Nurses, the Baylor University School of Nursing.

In October, 1920, the Baylor School of Law was opened, and in June, 1923, by order of the Supreme Court of the State of Texas, license was granted to graduates of the Baylor School of Law in the courts of Texas without examination.

In 1923 the Trustees of Baylor University established the School of Business which provided a combination of theoretical and practical courses in order to make possible a liberal education and at the same time provide adequate preparation for a business career.


For the past six months I have been in rather active association with the students of the School of Business, of Baylor University. It has been my pleasure to work with them and play with them.
