



NAME AND PURPOSE OF OUR LOCAL

Pi Sigma Delta is a fraternity organized to encourage scholarship; to further the association of students in the School of Business Administration for their mutual benefit and advancement; to bring about a closer relationship between students of business and the faculty; and to further the interests of the School of Business Administration by contact with the commercial world.

HISTORY OF PI SIGMA DELTA

The organization of Pi Sigma Delta this year was the result of the feeling among the faculty members and students of the School of Business Administration that a professional fraternity of a type such as we propose to make Pi Sigma Delta was needed to bring about a closer relationship among the outstanding students in that school.

In a conference held on February 28, 1930, between Mr. Lloyd B. Raisty, a faculty member, and seventeen outstanding members of the Junior and Senior classes, a discussion was held as to the advisability of organizing a professional fraternity in the School of Business Administration. Mr. Lloyd B. Raisty, a member of Delta Sigma Pi, explained the history and purpose of Delta Sigma Pi, and also read a letter from Mr. H. G. Wright, Grand Secretary of Delta Sigma Pi, with reference to our desire to organize and petition Delta Sigma Pi for a charter.

After a lengthy discussion of the proposition, and as a result of the unanimous opinion favoring such action, a temporary organization of the fraternity was effected, and it was unanimously voted to petition Delta Sigma Pi for a charter.

At a meeting held March 7, 1930 a permanent organization was effected. Permanent officers were elected, a constitution and by-laws adopted, and a committee was appointed to draw up the petition to present to Delta Sigma Pi. A Rushing Committee was also appointed and instructed to investigate other prominent students in the School of Business Administration with the view to increasing the membership of our local chapter. The school is large enough, however, that the membership of Pi Sigma Delta now stands at 39, composed of 3 faculty members, and 36 Junior, Senior and Graduate students, all of whom are very enthusiastic about the future work of Pi Sigma Delta.

At a banquet held by Pi Sigma Delta, May 3, 1930, we were honored in having with us Professor Karl D. Reyer of the University of Oklahoma, who gave us a very interesting talk regarding the work of Delta Sigma Pi, and discussed the essentials of a successful fraternity.

The final meeting of the school year 1929-30 was held May 23, 1930. Officers for the year 1930-31 were elected, and plans for the next school year were enthusiastically discussed and concurred in.

HISTORY OF THE
SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The School of Business Administration was first created in 1922. Work in business administration, however, was begun as early as 1912, but in connection with the College of Arts and Sciences. A distinctive degree, Bachelor of Business Administration, was first offered in the session of 1916-17.

For a student to be registered in the School of Business Administration, he must have completed 60 semester hours of work in the College of Arts and Sciences, of which 52 hours must be in certain required subjects, the other eight hours being presented in elective subjects. To secure the degree of Bachelor of Business Administration, the student must have completed 60 semester hours of work in the School of Business Administration, and have had from three to six months business experience, upon which he is required to present a report written under the direction of a faculty member.

HISTORY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS

The University of Texas is a state institution, ordained by constitution, located by popular vote, endowed and maintained by legislative grants. The conception of a University of Texas goes back to the Declaration of Texas Independence, which had for one of its main indictments against the government of Mexico the failure to establish any public system of education.

In 1837, a bill to incorporate the University of Texas was introduced in the Congress of the Republic. Definite provision for the establishment of the university was made in 1858, but was not carried out because of the Civil War and the unhappy era of Reconstruction, and not until 1881 was an act of organization framed by the legislature. It provided for the location of the institution by popular vote, and for the appointment of a Board of Regents to be entrusted with its organization and government. In 1883 the legislature added 1,000,000 acres of land to the 1,000,000 acres endowed to the university by the Act of 1858 to constitute a permanent building fund.

By popular election in September, 1881, the main university was located at Austin, and the medical branch at Galveston.

Under authority of the Board of Regents, the academic and law branches were organized.

The cornerstone of the first building was laid on November 17, 1882, and on September 15, 1883 the University was formally opened. The Medical School was opened in October, 1891. The College of Engineering was inaugurated in 1894; the Summer Session in 1898; the School of Education in 1906; the Division of Extension in 1909; the Graduate School in 1910; and the School of Business Administration in 1922. The College of Mines and Metallurgy was created in 1919, constituting the state school of mines and metallurgy, a branch of the University of Texas. It is located at El Paso.

As a state institution, the university derives the greater portion of its income directly or indirectly from the state. The lands, at first managed by the state Land Office, were put under the control of the Board of Regents by the legislature of 1895. From time to time, portions have been sold and proceeds invested in state bonds. But it soon proved that the land would not be enough for the support of the university. Therefore, each legislature since 1887 has made appropriations for running expenses. In 1923, oil production was started on the University lands, and since that time the receipts from the oil leases and royalties have amounted to fourteen millions of dollars. To legislative appropriations and income from land and bonds are to be added fees paid by students and the proceeds of endowment

funds donated by individuals and societies.

The office of president was not created until 1895, and since then has been filled as follows:

Austin, the home of the Main University, is easily the most beautifully situated city in the state. It lies at the point where the Colorado River issues from the canyon at the base of the Edwards Plateau. To the east stretch gently rolling plains. For healthfulness, moreover, Austin has no superior among the cities and towns of Texas. Its clear, pure air; its hilly surface; its almost constant breezes; its fine water; serve to keep the place remarkably free from sickness of any kind.

The grounds of the Main University consist of the original campus, a high-lying tract of forty acres between Twenty-first and Twenty-fourth streets about one-half mile north of the State

Capitol, which was set apart in the days of the Republic as a site for the University; a small tract of five acres lying to the east of the original campus, and known for many years as Clark Field, purchased in 1897 with funds donated largely by alumni; a body of some four hundred acres along the Colorado River, west of the city, which was given by the late George W. Brackenridge of San Antonio; and approximately one hundred thirty acres lying north of the original campus, for the purchase of which the Thirty-seventh legislature provided in 1921.

Buildings on the campus: Main Building, 1889; Chemistry Building to cost \$1,000,000 and now under construction; Engineering Building, 1891; Law Building, 1908; the second Power Building, 1910, now occupied by the University Press; Library Building, 1911; Education Building, 1918; Biological Laboratory, 1925; Garrison Hall, 1926--a recitation and office building; Biological Greenhouse, 1926; University Hall, erected in 1890 through a gift of George W. Brackenridge of San Antonio, and occupied at present by the Bureau of Business Research, the Students' Publications, Inc., the Business Administration faculty, and the Department of Architecture; Womans Building, 1903; New Power Building, 1928; Texas Memorial Stadium, 1924-25, seating capacity of 42,000; Auditorium-Gymnasium, 1930; Girls' Gymnasium now under construction; and three dormitories for girls erected through gifts.

Attendance at the Main University long session has grown

from 221 in 1883 to 5,853 in 1929. 3,155 students were registered in the Main University during the Summer Session of 1929. Total individual students in all branches of the University in the long session 1928-29 was 6,699, of which 590 were registered in the School of Business Administration.

CONSTITUTION OF PI SIGMA DELTA

PREAMBLE

A fraternity organized to encourage the study of business organization and procedure; to develop contacts with business leaders for their inspiration and guidance; to promote a higher standard of business ethics; and to encourage scholarship and mutual associations of business administration students.

ARTICLE I

Name

Section 1. This fraternity shall be officially known and designated as Pi Sigma Delta.

ARTICLE II

Organization and Government

Section 1. Officers and their election: The officers of this fraternity shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Rushing Supervisor, Faculty Advisor, and Sentinel. All officers shall be elected by secret ballot, a majority of the votes cast at a duly authorized meeting being necessary for a choice.

Section 2. Duties of officers: The duties, responsibilities and authority of all officers shall be as provided in the By-Laws of this fraternity.

Section 3. Term of office: The term of office for all officers shall be one complete semester following elections.

Section 4. Vacancies: In case of a vacancy in one of the offices, a member shall be elected to fill the unexpired term.

ARTICLE III

Qualifications of members

Section 1. The fraternal bonds of this fraternity shall include men of good moral character, of the Caucasian race, of Christian faith, and who are not members of any professional commerce fraternity.

Section 2. No person shall be initiated into this fraternity except by unanimous vote of all the active members present at a duly authorized meeting. In case there is one dissenting vote cast in an election of members, another ballot shall be immediately taken.

Section 3. Membership of this fraternity shall consist of Charter members, Active members, and Alumni members. Charter members shall consist of those persons who

are members of the proposed organization at the time of the adoption of this constitution. Immediately after the adoption of this constitution the Charter members shall become Active members of this chapter. Active members shall be duly initiated male students who are in good standing and pursuing regular courses in the School of Business Administration of the University of Texas, and members of the faculty of the School of Business Administration of the University of Texas. Alumni members shall be those who were Active members in good standing in the fraternity and in the School of Business Administration, who have graduated from, or who have ceased to pursue regular courses in the School of Business Administration of the University of Texas.

ARTICLE IV

Meetings of the Fraternity

Section 1. The meetings of the fraternity shall be those as provided for in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE V

Quorum

Section 1. A majority of all the active members shall constitute a quorum to do business and in no case shall

the fraternity be opened for business in the absence of a quorum.

Section 2. Two-thirds of the active members shall constitute a quorum for the election of officers or for the consideration of any matter relative to the amendment of the constitution.

ARTICLE VI

Committees.

Section 1. The President shall have the power to appoint all necessary committees.

ARTICLE VII

Amendments

Section 1. The constitution may be altered or amended by a three-fourths ($3/4$) vote of the fraternity as provided for in Article V, Section 2, above.

Section 2. All amendments must be proposed in writing, signed by two members, and remain on the table for one week before action can be taken on the same.

Pledge and Acceptance

We, the undersigned students of the School of Business Administration of the University of Texas, hereby pledge our support and acceptance of the Constitution of the Pi Sigma Delta fraternity as it appears in the foregoing pages:

BY-LAWS OF PI SIGMA DELTA

ARTICLE I

Order of Business

- Section 1. a. Roll call.
- b. Reading minutes.
- c. Election of pledges for membership.
- d. Election of pledges proposed.
- e. Proposals for pledgeship.
- f. Reports of committees.
- g. Unfinished business.
- h. New business.
- i. Adjournment.

ARTICLE II

Motions

- Section 1. In all cases not otherwise provided for, the fraternity shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE III

Regulations

- Section 1. Any member being absent at roll call shall be

fined fifty cents (50¢) for each offense unless a reasonable excuse is given.

Section 2. Any member more than ten minutes late to a meeting shall be fined twenty-five cents (25¢) unless a reasonable excuse is given.

Section 3. The fraternity as a whole shall decide on the validity of any excuse presented in accordance with Sections 1 and 2 of this article.

Section 4. Any member failing to perform the duty assigned to him shall be called upon to give reasons for his failure and shall be dealt with accordingly.

Section 5. Any member being absent from three consecutive regular meetings shall be suspended from the fraternity unless a valid excuse is presented.

Section 6. Any suspended member may be re-instated by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the chapter and by payment of all fines for absences.

ARTICLE IV

Meetings

Section 1. The regular meetings of the fraternity shall be held the first and third Friday of each month at 7:00 P. M.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President of the fraternity.

ARTICLE V

Dues

- Section 1. The dues of the fraternity shall be one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per semester.
- Section 2. The initiation fee for each member shall be two dollars (\$2.00) to be paid before the initiation is completed.

ARTICLE VI

Duties of Officers

- Section 1. The duties of the officers shall be such as commonly appertain to their respective offices.

ARTICLE VII

Miscellaneous

- Section 1. A motion to alter any of these by-laws must be in writing, signed by two members, and remain on the table for one week before a vote is taken on it.
- Section 2. Any by-law may be suspended for one evening only, by a two-thirds ($2/3$) vote of the members present.
- Section 3. Any by-law may be adopted, suspended, amended or replaced by a two-thirds ($2/3$) vote of the house after it has been on the table for one week.
- Section 4. These by-laws shall be in force from and after the time of their adoption.






I have been informed that Pi Sigma Delta, one of the fully organized professional clubs on the campus, is petitioning your fraternity for a chapter.
