

DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY.

In the City of Halifax, in the historic Province of Nova Scotia, is an Institution of Learning whose life-story is intimately associated with events of vital importance in the histories of three great nations.

The grounds on which the story of Dalhousie University may be traced from the events of those stirring days in the early part of the seventeenth century, when the Bourbon Kings were striving to plant the fleur-de-lis in the New World. Among the armies of adventurers, who, under the impulsion of Henry de Navarre, sailed to found a new France in "La Grande", was one Saint Costin who amassed a fortune from a trading-post which he established at the mouth of the Penobscot River. This post, which took from its founder the name of Costine, was fated to play the part in the founding of the first Free college of liberal learning for all the Canadian Dominions.

A century and a half passed with continual wars and resultant unsettledness. Certain events, however, bear direct upon this narrative. Through HISTORY granted to Sir William Alexander by King VI in 1607 OF the land of "New Scotland" which came the DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY applied to this province.

In the changing fortunes of the French settlement of Castine
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In the changing fortunes of war, the French settlement of Castine was possessed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and later became part of the State of Maine ---- a French, British, and United States possession in turn. During the war of 1812, it was a base for American privateers until captured by a British Expedition under Sir John Cope Sherbrooke who constituted it a customs port of entry. After the Treaty of Ghent, the British forces withdrew to Halifax, taking with them the customs collections amounting to the sum of £11,750. This "Castine Fund" was the first endowment of Dalhousie University, and we may thus trace the origin of this College by the Sea to sources in the history of France, Great Britain, and the United States of America.

It is to Scotland, however, that she owes her birth. Shortly before the evacuation of the Castine ports, George Ramsay, ninth Earl of Dalhousie, had been appointed Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia, and to him fell the disposition of the "Castine Fund". At that time, the only institution of higher learning in the country was King's College, open only to students of the Anglican faith, and entirely under the control of the Church of England. Lord Dalhousie perceived the great need for a more liberal institution and in 1818 founded the non-sectarian University which bears his name. His last public act in Nova Scotia was the laying of the corner stone on the Grand Parade in

1820. Shortly afterwards his appointment as Governor-General necessitated his removal from Halifax.

Due to mismanagement and official opposition, the college of his founding fell upon evil days until 1838, when the Rev. Dr. Thomas McCulloch was called from the famous Pictou Academy to become its first President. An ardent reformer and a friend of the great Canadian Statesman, Joseph Howe, this brilliant man kept the Institution going largely by the force of his own personality, in the face of tremendous opposition. At his death in 1843 came a crisis ---- its funds almost exhausted, Dalhousie closed its doors. In 1863 it was reorganized on a new basis and Dalhousie entered upon a new era.

The Rev. James Ross, D.D., became the second President and under his guidance and that of the eminent scholars who constituted its teaching staff, the college prospered for many years. However, financial difficulties again arose. But this time a deliverer was at hand. Dr. Ross resigned in 1885 and was succeeded by the Rev. John Forrest. It was then that George Munro, a brother-in-law of Dr. Forrest, came forward with his magnificent gifts which in all amounted to \$320,000. This generous man saved Dalhousie and under "Lord John" it prospered mightily. When, in 1911, he gave up his office after twenty-six years of splendid service, the college had twice outgrown its quarters, moving first from the Grand Parade to the "Forrest

Building", and then purchasing the forty acre property known as "Studley" where the erection of the stately buildings of modern Dalhousie was begun in 1912.

It was about this time that the fourth and present President took office. Dr. A. Stanley Mackenzie has devoted nineteen years of magnificent work to the development of the new Dalhousie, and the results of his labour and those of his associates are apparent in the University of to-day which takes its place in the first rank of Canadian institutions of learning. The departments have grown to include Arts and Science, Law, Medicine, Commerce, Dentistry, Engineering, Pharmacy and Music. In 1927, Dalhousie established the first School of Fisheries in Canada. The student body numbers nearly 1,000 and its members are drawn from all over this continent and even further afield. Through the generosity of the Carnegie and Rockefeller foundations and of many individual benefactors the endowment has been greatly increased.

By the affiliation, in 1925, of King's College and Dalhousie University, the hopes of Lord Dalhousie were finally realized and the recent erection of the new King's building has added greatly to the Studley Campus.

HISTORY OF THE COMMERCE DEPARTMENT.

In 1880 it was agreed that to meet the demands of the business world a special course in business preparation was needed. At that time no such course was being given at any Canadian University east of Montreal and so there was a distinct need. Accordingly, in that year Dalhousie established a Department of Commerce in the Faculty of Arts and Science. Through the generosity of Mr. W. A. Black, a prominent business man of Halifax and who later became Minister of Railways and Canals in the Federal Government, a gift enabled the University to appoint a Professor of Commerce. This appointment is known as the W. A. Black Chair of Commerce. The course offered was a four year one leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce. Students enrolled in this Department also took lectures in the Department of Economics, from other Professors in the Arts and Science Faculty, and two courses in the School of Law.

Henry G. Hunt, of Boston, a graduate of Boston University, became the first Professor of Commerce and classes were started in the fall of 1880. The first Degree was awarded in the year 1888.

The enrollment increased slowly for the first five years. In 1888-89, Professor Hunt was given leave of absence for further study and James H. MacDonald, B. A., (St. Francis Xavier), was appointed to fill the position. Professor Hunt returned the

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following year but in 1927 he resigned. In August of the same year the Board of Governors appointed G. K. Ganong to the Chair of Commerce. The enrollment dropped considerably this year, doubtless due to the many recent changes and the resultant uncertainty. In the following Spring Professor Ganong resigned. During the Summer, James M. MacDonald was appointed to the Chair and head of the Commerce Department. Professor MacDonald had just completed further study at Harvard, having been awarded the degree of M. B. A. This year the enrollment increased considerably.

During the Summer of 1930, the Board of Governors realizing the importance of the Commerce Department, appointed another full-time man to the Staff, in the person of R. W. Ellis, also a graduate of the Harvard Business School. A slight change was made in the courses and when the Fall term opened in September 1930, the Freshman class in Commerce was the largest on record. Now, that a good start has been made, the Department more settled, courses improved, another Professor appointed, the enrollment at the highest point as yet, and the Board of Governors apparently realizing the importance of the Commerce Department, we can doubtless expect to see much progress there. Already the Department has grown from the smallest to the third largest, being surpassed only by the Arts and Science Department, and the famous Medical School; and surpassing the Dental School, the Law School, and Engineering Department in the number of students enrolled.

SEGA VAPPA HUI FRATERNITY

HISTORY OF ZETA KAPPA PHI.

The history of Zeta Kappa Phi fraternity goes back to April 1st, 1928, for on that day 22 chaps met at the Commerce House and adopted a constitution and set of by-laws, prepared by a previously appointed committee, and thus Zeta Kappa Phi came into existence.

Of course there has been several earlier meetings to discuss the matter and to appoint committees to prepare plans. These gatherings were purely organizational; a start was made in the fall of 1927 and this culminated on April 1, 1928.

Zeta Kappa Phi can be considered a logical outgrowth of the Commerce Society, an organization of commerce students founded shortly after the opening of the department. Incidentally the first President of that society is one of our alumni members. The Commerce Society filled a need and was the only organization of students in that department. Meanwhile fraternities were formed in other departments of the University and several students in commerce began to discuss plans of forming a professional fraternity in their own field. Upon the opening of the fall term in 1927, several of the men in the commerce department, decided upon a commerce residence. Accordingly, the Commerce House was established that fall at 14 Oxford Street directly opposite the Study House. With ten students living in residence it was quite natural that the HISTORY of forming a Commerce Fraternity should receive further discussion. It was argued that while the

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affiliants. Furthermore, owing to the small freshman class in Commerce Society had its place it did not supply all that was wanted. The chief deficiency was that the latter organization did not offer any means for the graduate to keep in touch with the University and especially the Commerce Department. In addition the Society was a very loose-knit organization and there was little incentive to keep together; in short there were no ties. To fill these wants, Zeta Kappa Phi came into existence.

In April 1928 our present badge and ritual were adopted and the officers elected were as follows:

SPECIFIC HISTORY: SEASON 1928 - 1929.

This year the Commerce House, at 14 Oxford Street, was taken over by the Fraternity and was known as the Zeta Kappa Phi Fraternity House. During the fall, several meetings were held.

In November, Brother Jubien was forced to retire, due to the pressure of business, from the office of Secretary-Treasurer and Brothers Merton and Rowlings were appointed to carry on the work temporarily. The matter of affiliation with an international or national commerce fraternity was discussed; ^{we} were informed that no such organization existed. Then it was suggested that it might be worth while for Zeta Kappa Phi to become a purely social fraternity in order that it might be possible at a later date to

affiliate. Furthermore, owing to the small freshmen class in commerce difficulty would be experienced in securing new members. However, action was deferred until the fall of 1929 and in the meantime a special committee was appointed to look into the matter of affiliation, said committee to report back at the first meeting in the fall. Election of officers resulted as follows:

SEASON 1929 - 1930

The opening of classes in 1929 made things more hopeful for Zeta Kappa Phi. In the first place, a new department head had been appointed, and secondly, there was a large freshmen class in commerce.

At the first meeting of the fraternity, the report of the special committee on affiliation was heard. Its salient features were these--

- (1) The time was too premature for affiliation.
 - (2) That in view of the large freshmen class in commerce it would be advisable to continue as a professional fraternity.
 - (3) And, at a later date to consider sponsoring a Canadian National Professional Commerce Fraternity.
 - (4) That certain alterations be made in the constitution and by-laws.--
- (a) THAT exact status of Zeta Kappa Phi as a professional commerce fraternity be written in.
 - (b) THAT there be a revision of the procedure of admitting new members.
 - (c) THAT the office of Secretary-Treasurer be divided.

This report was later adopted in full and the recommended changes were carried out. Election of officers to fill the new posts and also to fill a vacancy on the executive caused by the removal of Brother McColl from the City, resulted as follows:

Secretary	-	Herbert C. Morton.
Treasurer	-	John R. MacFarlane.
Executive	-	Murray M. Rankin.

This year the fraternity house was located at 69 Spring Garden Road, which house, unfortunately resulted in a financial loss to the fraternity owing to its rather antiquated heating system. During the year we added several members to our roll.

The fraternity was informed that there were two large international fraternities in commerce and in November correspondence was entered into with Delta Sigma Pi. On April 4th, 1930, Mr. H. G. Wright, Grand Secretary-Treasurer of Delta Sigma Pi visited us and was a guest at our annual banquet. As a result of Mr. Wright's visit and the correspondence with the Central Office, Zeta Kappa Phi, on April 9th, 1930, voted unanimously to petition Delta Sigma Pi.

In order to facilitate matters it was decided to make Zeta Kappa Phi an undergraduate fraternity with the alumni forming an Alumni Club. Therefore, as an amendment to the motion to petition Delta Sigma Pi, it was agreed that the constitution of Zeta Kappa Phi be revised, following that of Delta Sigma Pi, retaining our own badge, pledge and ritual.







CONSTITUTION OF ZETA KAPPA PHI

AS REVISED

APRIL 9, 1930.

- PREAMBLE:** The objects of this Fraternity shall be to create a spirit of brotherhood and group interests; to further the interests of Dalhousie University and especially those of the Commerce Department thereof; and to foster good ethics and high ideals in business.
- ARTICLE I. Name:**
This Fraternity shall be known as the Zeta Kappa Phi Fraternity, a professional fraternity operating in the field of commerce.
- ARTICLE II. Membership and Initiation:**
Delta Sigma Pi Article VI, omitting section 6.
- ARTICLE III. Chapter Officers:**
Delta Sigma Pi Article VII.
- ARTICLE IV. Discipline of the Individual:**
Delta Sigma Pi Article X; sections 1, 2, 3a, 4a, 7, 8.
- ARTICLE V. Finances:**
(a) The initiation fee shall be fifteen dollars.
(b) The annual dues shall be decided at each annual meeting of the Fraternity.
- ARTICLE VI. Official Insignia:**
(a) There shall be two badges of this Fraternity, the ordinary membership badge to be worn by fully qualified members, and the pledge button to be worn by pledge members.
(b) These badges are the property of the Fraternity and must be returned upon demand.
- ARTICLE VII. Amendments to Constitution:**
This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at the annual meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose.

BY-LAWS OF ZETA KAPPA PHI

AS REVISED

APRIL 9, 1930.

- Section 1. Order of Business:
(a) Calling of the meeting to order.
(b) Roll call
(c) Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.
(d) Committee reports.
(e) Old business
(f) New Business.
- Section 2. Eligibility to vote:
No member shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Fraternity unless all moneys due from him to the Fraternity have been paid.
- Section 3. Meetings:
Delta Sigma Pi Section 116.
- Section 4. Membership and Initiation:
Delta Sigma Pi Sections 121, 122, 125, 126, 127.
- Section 5. Officers:
Delta Sigma Pi sections 131-140 inclusive.
- Section 6. Finances:
(a) The initiation fee shall be fifteen dollars.
(b) The annual dues shall be decided at each annual meeting of the Fraternity. They shall be payable half-yearly, on or before October 31st, and January 15th. Members in arrears for more than one week after these dates shall receive notice of suspension.
- Section 7. Discipline:
Delta Sigma Pi sections 161-164 inclusive.
- Section 8. Amendments:
These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at the annual meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose.
