





General Information

HISTORY Reno was founded on May 9, 1868, during the building of the Central Pacific Railroad. Formerly called Lake's Crossing the city's location in the Truckee Meadows became an important rail transfer point to Virginia City and was named Reno in honor of a Civil War Hero, General Jesse Reno.

Sparks, immediately adjoining Reno in the Truckee Meadows, was later selected and laid out by the Central Pacific as a division point and was named for Governor John Sparks of Nevada. The two cities shared the same boundary and formed a single trading and market area.

POPULATION Reno today is a dynamic modern city of 80,000 persons. Sparks, adjoining Reno has a population of about 28,000 and the Reno-Sparks metropolitan area has a total population of over 128,000.

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION Reno is located at the base of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, and on the edge of Nevada deserts. A drive of several miles will take you to heavily-forested mountains, or to arid desert that stretches hundreds of miles to the east. Reno is approximately 4,500 feet high and is immediately situated in the Truckee Meadows, so named because of abundant water that transformed the desert plateau into grassland.

CLIMATE Reno enjoys a moderate climate. Winters are mild, with moderate snow and temperatures and a high percentage of sunshine. Winters include below-freezing temperatures and some below-zero temperatures, although warm day-time temperatures of 65-70° are not unusual in January and February. Summer temperatures generally range in the 80's with 90% sunshine, little rainfall, and generally cool evenings.

WHAT TO WEAR Dress in Reno is considered casual, although coats and ties are generally required for dinner shows. Winter months require sweaters and coats. Summers are warm and dry.

ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT Industrial growth is rapidly influencing Reno's environment, complimenting emphasis on tourist-centered and recreation activities. Agriculture, mining, manufacturing, warehousing, construction and transportation industries all contribute to the Reno economy.

TAXES Nevada has no personal income tax or inheritance tax. Personal property tax rates are based on \$5.00 per \$100.00 assessed valuation, usually set at about 35% of full-cash value. 3½% sales tax is levied on most retail purchases. Industry enjoys advantages of Nevada's unique Freeport Law which permits tax-free storage of goods destined for out-of-state markets.

CHURCHES All major religious denominations are represented. For information as to religious service schedules, addresses and names of churches, write the Greater Reno Chamber of Commerce stating information as to the specific church or denomination.

HOSPITALS Reno is the medical center for a large area in Nevada and Northern California. There are two large hospitals: St. Mary's Hospital, 235 West 6th Street, and Washoe Medical Center at Kirman and Mill Streets. Both hospitals have recently completed new additions. The Veterans Hospital is located at 1000 Locust Street in Reno. The Nevada State Mental Hospital is located in Sparks, Nevada, three miles from Reno.

SCHOOLS There are 52 public schools in Washoe County; 39 elementary schools, 7 junior high schools and 6 high schools. The entire school system is under the supervision of the State of Nevada Education Department. The Reno and Sparks high schools are members in good standing of the Northwest Accrediting Association. There are 5 Catholic elementary schools and one Catholic high school. For information write to: Diocesan Superintendent of Schools, 400 Bartlett Street, Reno.

UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA The University of Nevada's main campus in Reno features beautiful landscaped grounds and lawns, a modernistic new library and scenic attractiveness, and is located on rolling hills at the north edge of Reno. The University carries out a complex variety of activities and programs designed to serve most of the higher educational needs of the State of Nevada.

TRANSPORTATION Reno is serviced with extensive bus, rail and air connections, and enjoys good highway connections for travel to all western cities. Because of its location and transportation facilities Reno actually serves as a hub between eastern and western passenger and freight traffic. The Southern Pacific Railroad operates passenger and freight service out of Reno. The Western Pacific operates freight service to this area but no direct passenger service. United Airlines, Western Airlines and Air West serve Reno at the present time. Bus service is furnished by Continental Trailways, Pacific Greyhound, LTR Stage Lines and Nevada Central Motor Lines. Scheduled scenic tours are offered by Gray Line Tours. Local bus service is provided by Pioneer Bus Lines.

Local Interest & Recreation

RENO SCENIC DRIVE Enjoy a pleasant 2½ hour drive of Reno, Nevada. The scenic drive takes you past the University of Nevada, fine residential areas, the downtown gaming area, bordering agricultural districts, local schools, parks and other city highlights. Stop by the Greater Reno Chamber of Commerce Hospitality Center at 150 So. Virginia for the scenic drive map.

CONVENTION IN RENO . . . just for the fun of it! Located right in the heart of this fun city, the Pioneer Theater Auditorium has facilities for delegations up to 1,500 people, and joins the convention facilities excellence already maintained by the Centennial Coliseum, located three miles south of the center of the city with seating for up to 8,000 delegates.

CITY PARKS Reno has 24 parks covering an area of 148.3 acres, approximately three acres per 1,000 population which is about three times the national average. Parks and facilities include tennis courts, two municipal swimming pools, picnic areas, ponds, lakes and shrubbery.

Open to the public from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday except noon hour and on holidays.

THE HARRAH AUTOMOBILE COLLECTION The largest and most elaborate collection of antique, vintage and classic automobiles in the world, with 750-plus cars on display to the public. Also displayed is a fully restored antique locomotive, plus an exceptional Pony Express exhibit. The tour includes shop areas where skilled craftsmen rebuild automobiles to original factory specifications. You may drive yourself or ride the free bus. HAROLDS CLUB GUN COLLECTION The world's finest antique gun collection is on display in Harolds Club second floor. CHILD CARE Baby sitters and private child-care facilities are available for Reno visitors. All child-care facilities are registered with the State of Nevada Welfare Board and provide recreation, care and feeding services for children two years of age and older. LAKE TAHOE The Lake of the Sky, 6,200 feet high in the nearby Sierra Nevadas and surrounded by forests, Lake Tahoe may be reached by several routes, south on 395 to the Mt. Rose Road, or through Carson City and over Highway 50 and Spooner Summit, or west on Interstate 80 and past Squaw Valley.






About the University

The University of Nevada is a coeducational land-grant institution established by the Nevada State Constitution in 1864, the year of the state's admission into the Union. It began operation in 1874 in Elko as a preparatory higher school before being permanently relocated in Reno in 1886.

College-level study was first offered in Morrill Hall, the single building on campus, in 1887. This venerable building still is in use and is the subject of an Alumni Association fund-raising drive to renovate and preserve it.

For many years the Reno facility served as Nevada's only institution of higher learning. In an administrative reorganization in 1968, the name was changed to University of Nevada, Reno, making it one of four components in the University of Nevada System. The other three are the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, the Desert Research Institute, and the Community College Division.

While the University of Nevada, Reno, has grown steadily by every standard, it is still a relatively small, personalized, university where the student is offered intimate contact with every form of higher education.

Fully accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools, the University offers major fields of study through more than fifty academic departments in ten schools and colleges. Degrees are awarded through the Colleges of Agriculture, Arts and Science, Business Administration, Education, and Engineering; the Schools of Home Economics, Medical Sciences, Mines, and Nursing; and the Graduate School.

The campus also is the academic home of the National College of the State Judiciary and the National College of Juvenile Justice.

The 195-acre campus, occupied by 50 major buildings, covers rolling hills a few blocks north of the busy Reno business district. It commands a picturesque view of the Truckee Meadow and the Sierra Nevada mountains, on which are located a number of the nation's outstanding ski areas, including Squaw Valley, site of the 1960 Winter Olympics.

Within an hour of the campus, students and visitors can drive to beautiful Lake Tahoe, the largest lake at its altitude in the world, or to Pyramid Lake, a unique prehistoric sea. Other nearby points of interest in addition to Reno itself include Virginia City, setting for one of the West's richest mining bonanzas; Carson City, the colorful state capital; and Genoa, the state's first pioneer settlement.



The College of Business Administration offers degree programs in Accounting, Economics, Finance, Institutional Management, Management, Marketing, Office Administration, Public Administration, and Real Estate. In all four-year majors offered by the college, law school preparation may also be obtained.

Degrees which may be obtained include Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, Master of Arts, Master of Science, and Master of Business Administration.

A Career in Business

A successful career in business depends in large measure upon educational background. Ability, ambition and opportunity can be severely handicapped if that background is inadequate.

The student may hope to enter advertising, accounting, banking, sales, general management, production, or become a professional teacher of economics and business administration. Through formal business and social education, a selected career goal is more realistic and attainable.

The goals of the College of Business Administration are to prepare the individual to enter the professional business fields of their choice and to develop a mature understanding of the world and society in which they live and work.

A liberal education in humanities, arts, and the sciences is indispensable to these goals. Each student is encouraged and counseled in selecting a well-founded base in both business and economics courses and courses in psychology, sociology, mathematics, science, English, speech, political science, and others.


The College of Business Administration is a fully accredited member of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, and as a major college of the University of Nevada is fully accredited by the

Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools.


Accounting and Information Systems

Accounting supplies the financial data used by management in making rational business decisions. As the supplier of this information, the accountant is a respected member of the management team. Due to the increased complexity of business, accounting has become one of the fastest growing areas of business with the demand for well-trained people exceeding the supply. The accountant's work is dynamic, challenging, and financially rewarding. The profession of accountancy is becoming increasingly divergent, encompassing such areas as management advisory services, operations research, data processing, operational audits, corporate tax planning, and cost analysis and control. A student with an aptitude in accounting will find unlimited opportunities for creative work, professional recognition, financial reward, and public service.

The Accounting option provides the student with a sound knowledge of basic accounting principles. The program is designed to prepare the student for positions of leadership and responsibility in industry, government, and public accounting. The preparation is based upon the development of a thorough knowledge and understanding of the general field of accounting and the ability to apply this knowledge to managerial, financial, economic, and general business situations.

The Information Systems option prepares the student for a career in the rapidly growing field of electronic data processing.

Economics

The curricula for students majoring in Economics are aimed at providing an understanding of the theoretical background of the science which makes comprehension and analysis of economic conditions and problems easier and more complete.

A student who earns a degree in Business Administration with a major in Economics receives training which assists both in business operations and in the role of the individual as a leading member of society. Majors in Economics with a Bachelor of Arts degree are prepared for positions of economists in business or in public service, or for graduate study, with a view to entering the academic field.

For these purposes, courses are given in the theory

of price and output determination, and in the theory of national income and employment as well as in money and banking, public finance, government regulation of business, labor economics, and other related courses. Included in the Department of Economics are the statistical courses of the College of Business Administration and other courses in quantitative method.

Degrees offered in economics are Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts, Master of Science, and Master of Arts.

Managerial Sciences Department

The Managerial Sciences Department brings together the individual managerial disciplines of Finance, Management, and Marketing. In addition, the Department includes, under Finance, the related studies and programs in Real Estate, Insurance, and Business Law. The student in the Managerial Sciences Department may choose to concentrate his studies in any one of these individual subject areas.

Finance includes the study of the procurement and management of funds for a business, other organizations, or an individual. For students majoring in the field, special emphasis is placed upon a perusal of the financial management for business enterprise, commercial banking, investment policy, security analysis and insurance.

Special concentrations in real estate and insurance offer planned programs emphasizing the fundamentals and principal of each of the growing areas of professional interest.


Opportunities in modern professional management demand a soundly based business and social education to supplement on the job management experience.

Management theory, philosophy, organization, policy production methods analysis, systems, procedures, and personnel administration are among the management subjects that are studied in a broad program designed to simulate the problems and situations of the actual business world.

Marketing embraces those economic activities directed toward and incident to the flow of goods and services from the producer to the consumer. This field of study is recommended for those students who are interested in direct participation in the creation of consumer satisfaction through sales, advertising, market research, export-import, wholesaling, retailing, and transportation.


Office Administration

Majors in Office Administration may elect a four-year degree program leading to a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. The program includes courses in stenography, typewriting, business machines, and accounting.

The Office Administration program is designed to acquaint students with the business world and prepare them for secretarial and other duties related to office administration.

Students in the four-year program may concentrate technical courses into the first two years enabling them to establish their secretarial competencies and then procure part-time employment while attending school. At the completion of the first two years, the students are able to qualify for employment requiring less than a four-year degree.

The Business Education option is designed to prepare students to teach business subjects in secondary schools. The academic adviser will help the student select courses which provide a thorough background in business subjects and satisfy the requirements for teacher certification.

Business As a Foundation For a Legal Career

Law is a professional field of great variety and specialization ranging from general law to specialization in taxes, patents, criminal law, and other areas.

Career opportunities are many in private practice and in government business employment. Complex legal problems and the enactment of many new state and federal statutes have made law of increasing importance to all types of businesses and organizations.

A student of law needs a well-planned education and those qualities of high personal character required in a profession of skill, trust and responsibility. Whatever special area of law an individual may wish to study, a sound background of business and economic principles can prove of exceptional value.

Each of the majors in the College of Business Administration includes study in all the basic areas of business and economics and qualifies the student for admission to most schools of law.

Graduate Study

The College of Business Administration offers four graduate degree programs: Master of Arts and Master of Science in Economics, Master of Science in Business Administration, and Master of Business Administration. The graduate programs require at least 30 hours of graduate work including a thesis. A non-thesis option is available.

A student need not have a bachelor's degree in business or economics in order to enter the graduate program. Degrees in engineering, arts and science, agriculture or the like are acceptable, but as many as 63 credits may be required for the master's degree depending upon the amount of business and economics in the student's background.

Each year the College of Business Administration awards a limited number of graduate fellowships to promising Nevada and out-of-state graduate students. (Stipend: \$1,250 or \$2,500 and waiver of regular fees and out-of-state tuition.)

Bureau of Business and Economic Research

Helping to expand knowledge of our economy is the basic responsibility of the Bureau of Business and Economic Research. Through special study, research and investigation, the bureau aids the University, the State of Nevada, and private business.

Each month, the bureau publishes the Nevada Business Review with special articles on research projects dealing with Nevada and reports on Nevada business activity. From time to time monographs reporting on the research carried on by members of the faculty of the college are published.

Graduate fellows and students are employed in the bureau where they learn how to conduct business and economic research, analysis and investigation.


During the Spring semester the Professional Program Committee performed an effective job in bringing before the Fraternity speakers well informed in the fields of merchandising and buying and real estate.
