
May I take this means of recommending the action which would establish a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi in the School of Business on the campus at Western Michigan University.







You have shown some interest I understand in permitting a Chapter of your splendid fraternity to be organized on the Campus of Western Michigan University.



THE HISTORY

OF

WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY

The first school in the western part of the state was the Western State Normal School, which was founded in 1863. In 1912 the legislature completely reorganized the western part of the state. Western State Normal School was closed and its courses in 1912. Dwight S. Baker, who had recently organized the normal school, was its first president, and for a period of a year, with a fine mind, guided the school in national recognition. When he retired in 1915, 1900 students were being given training on a campus of 57 acres. In the administration of Paul V. Brennan, the president, the college achieved noteworthy results, with an enrollment of 600 students. It is now known that the administration of only two presidents have the state U.S. of Western Michigan College, and Dwight S. Baker's name is always shared through with the University has passed by legislative enactment in 1907, 1927, 1941, and 1957. respectively up to 1961 when Dr. Joseph Conrad and James M. Kelley became president of the University. The school has built up its reputation to its present state of 1961 students.

Western Michigan University has long been a national center in the training of elementary and secondary teachers, a reputation and effective program of better teacher preparation. Since 1912 when Dr. T. H. Morgan was a president of the institution which, with other states of the American Education, has greatly increased the reputation of the school. Today the University, in addition to offering the 12 and 16 degree which are a specialization for teaching, offers terminal courses in such varied fields as Education, Business, Law, and Social Sciences, and degree courses in Education, Social Science, and Law. The school has a fine reputation, since 1912 the University has granted the Bachelor's degree. In 1961, the University of Michigan received more than 1,000 students in selective classes and departments.

The University is divided into five colleges, each with a large faculty and staff. The colleges are: College of Education, College of Business, College of Arts and Sciences, College of Law, and College of Health, Education, and Society. The University is a member of the Association of American Universities and the Association of Publicly Owned Universities. History of Western Michigan University

From its earliest statehood, Michigan has been a pioneer in public education. Its first constitution, in 1835, created the nation's first Superintendent of Public Instruction, and John D. Pierce, the first man to hold the title, laid good foundations. This system of public education, reaching from the primary schools through a university, trained its primary teachers in branches of the university. Three years after 1846, when financial stringency had closed these branches, the legislature created the Michigan State Normal School, the first west of the Appalachian Mountains. Later, to meet the needs of a growing population, the legislature authorized the Central Michigan Normal School in 1895 and the Northern State Normal School in 1899.

In 1903 legislative enactment created a fourth to serve the southwestern counties of the state. Western State Normal School opened its doors in 1904. Dwight B. Waldo, who had recently organized the northern school, was its first president, and for a third of a century, with a firm hand, guided Western to national recognition. When he retired in 1936, 1800 students were using seven buildings on a campus of 57 acres. In the administration of Paul V. Sangren, his successor, the college achieved university status, with an enrollment of 6875 students. It is noteworthy that the administrations of only two presidents cover the whole life of Western Michigan College, and Western Michigan University---the phases through which the University has passed by legislative enactment in 1903, 1927, 1941, and 1957, respectively up to 1961 when Dr. Sangren retired and James W. Miller became president of the University. The school has since built up its enrollment to its current mark of 9271 students.

Western Michigan University has long been a national influence in the training of elementary and secondary teachers, a persistent and effective advocate of better teacher preparation. Soon after World War I, there began a broadening of the curriculum; which, much accelerated in the Sangren Administration, has greatly changed the character of the school. Today the University, in addition to granting the AB and BS degrees with or without specialization for teaching, offers terminal courses in such special fields as Petroleum Distribution and Small Business Management, and degree courses in Occupational Therapy, Speech Correction, Pulp and Paper Technology, and Librarianship. Since 1952 the University has granted the Master's Degree. In 1956-57, the Division of Field Services enrolled more than 7,200 students in extension classes and correspondence courses.

The University is divided into five schools, each with a Dean: Applied Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Graduate Studies. Assisting the President are two Vice-Presidents, one in charge of academic matters, the other of student services and public relations. The University is tax supported, though it receives substantial gifts and grants. It is under the control of

the State Board of Education, an elected body of four persons, including the Superintendent of Public Instruction. It is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools (1927), the National Council of Accreditation of Teacher Education (1928), the Association of American Universities (1946), and the National Association of Schools of Music (1951).

Before enrollment, students are interviewed in the Counseling and Guidance Office, which also advises them in curricular and personal matters through their college years. Each of the fifteen resident halls have counseling services under the direction of the Dean of Men and the Dean of Women. The University operates a Placement Office for graduating students and alumni. In the Health Service Building students receive care for minor illnesses and for emergencies. They find there also the clinical services of medical and surgical consultants, psychiatrists, a dermatologist and a dentist. The University has approved a student accident and illness insurance plan. Other student services, much used for remedial and therapeutic purposes, are the Psycho-Educational, Speech, Writing and Reading Clinics.

The buildings of the University are situated on two campuses connected by the playing and athletic fields. On the seventy acre east campus is the Business Building, which contains the business library; the Health Service Building; three resident halls, all built since 1938; the Women's Gym; and six classroom buildings, one of them housing the Campus Training School. On the one hundred eighty acres of the west campus are five classroom buildings, one of them housing the Administration offices; the Kanley Memorial Chapel; the University Center; twelve resident halls housing 2,375 women and 1,300 men; two-hundred fifty units for married students; and thirty-two faculty apartments in two buildings. Here also are the Men's Physical Educational Building, with a 42 by 75 foot pool; a field house seating 6,000; and a nine hole golf course. On this campus the Waldo Library, with 250,000 volumes and 1,700 periodicals was just opened in 1958. Between the east and west campuses are the baseball and football fields with seats for 2,5000 and 15,000 spectators, respectively. The University also operates a demonstration farm of one hundred fifty acres, and supervises the Kleinstuck Wildlife Preserve of fifty acres.

As to the future, a most conservative estimate of Western Michigan University will have an enrollment of approximately twenty thousand students by 1970. To meet this expected enrollment the University has requested appropriations of approximately two million dollars per year in new classroom facilities. More than one hundred acres have been set aside for new dormitories, four which are under construction at the present time.




The School of Business had its beginning in a report submitted to President Springer's Office by the founder and now dean of the School of Business. In 1947, Frank J. Schneider, an ambitious and determined individual, envisioned that the then functioning Department of Business Education should be reformed as a multi-purpose department with particular emphasis upon the business Administration curriculum ultimately leading to the Bachelor of Business Administration degree.

At this period (1947) the business Administration practice was in operation through the cooperation of the Economics and Business Education departments. The student was required to take twelve hours in the business education Department consisting of six hours of accounting principles and six hours of business law. An additional twelve hours in the Economics Department led to a major in business Administration. For the most part, this program was sound and it reflected the practice current in most liberal arts colleges that professed to offer a major in business Administration.

As enrollment increased, the school requested the State Board to grant them a degree in the field of business Administration.

Thus, one year later in September 1953, the request was granted. In 1954, fourteen BBA degrees were presented and 1960, ten hundred and four degrees were presented.

Schneider, an ambitious and determined individual, envisioned that the then functioning Department of Business Education should be developed as a multi-purpose department with particular emphasis upon the Business Administration curriculum ultimately leading to the Bachelor of Business Administration degree.

At this period (1947) the business administration program was in operation through the co-operation of the Economics and Business Education departments. The student was required to take twelve hours in the business education department consisting of six hours of accounting principles and six hours of business law. It is from this base that Dean Schneider developed the present School of Business with its manifold offerings. The curriculum for the Bachelor of Business Administration degree is so constructed as to make it possible to achieve the objectives in four basic phases:

1. Basic studies requirements
2. Core curriculum in business subjects
3. Field of concentration in business
4. Electives to meet specific interest and needs of the students.

The School of Business offers three main programs:

1. Business Administration-Bachelor of Business Administration Degree
2. Business Teacher Education- BS, BA, or the BBA degree with a State Secondary Provisional Certificate
3. Two-year curricula leading to a certificate:
 - a. Cooperative program in secretarial training
 - b. Cooperative program in retailing
 - c. Technical business program.

The management and marketing areas will become separate departments September 1, 1962. The new marketing department will offer a major in Retailing.

Graduate work leading to the Master of Business Administration degree is also offered in cooperation with the School of Graduate Studies. In the second year of the graduate program (1962) more than one hundred students are enrolled in the MBA program.

In the near future the School of Business is looking forward to a membership in the American Association of the Collegiate Schools of Business. The school's objectives are now under a study project by the American Association of the Collegiate Schools of Business.

This rapid growth in the School of Business at Western Michigan University indicates the pressing need for a professional business fraternity to foster the study of business through a professional organization.


