Albany, the seat of State Government, has a large number of state employees. There is a greater proportion of persons engaged in professional, technical, clerical and sales occupations than in any other area of upstate New York. The area's colleges and universities have placed their curriculum emphasis on producing students to fit tomorrow's needs.

Albany is the location of the Niagara Mohawk Power Company's Eastern Division operation, and the upstate headquarters of the New York Telephone Company.

The Albany elementary and secondary school systems are moving ahead with today's demands. Albany has historically been a seat of education, having many institutions of higher education located within its area. These include the State University of New York at Albany, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Sienna College, and Union College.

Albany is the marketing center of a great trading area. This primary marketing area encompasses Ulster and Dutchess counties, the Mohawk Valley, western Massachusetts, the state of Vermont, and southeastern Canada. The secondary marketing area takes in more distant sections of the state and the metropolitan New York City area. Albany is also a noted retail and wholesale center.

Greater Albany's banking facilities are unsurpassed in any area of comparable size in the United States. Thirty-five life insurance companies are represented in

Albany. In addition, there are 17 brokerage firms in the area which are members of the New York Stock Exchange. These banking, insurance, and investment institutions play an important role in the economic progress and stability of the area and are well-equipped to serve the financial needs of new and expanding business.

Business leaders in our community have long recognized the importance of exceptional cultural and recreational opportunities. The oldest chartered city in the nation, Albany has maintained its early culture and has also encouraged the contemporary arts.



THE GOV. ALFRED E. SMITH STATE OFFICE BUILDING

Located on Capitol Hill, the Smith Office Building contains the offices of the State Senators and Assemblymen. It is the tallest building in the City of Albany.



THE DELAWARE AND HUDSON BUILDING

Located in downtown Albany, the building was the original home of the Delaware and Hudson Railroad Company. Today the building houses the offices of several companies.

The present State University of New York at Albany was founded in 1844 as a Normal School whose purpose was to train teachers for the public schools of New York State. Six years later, the Board of Regents of the State of New York gave the Normal School the responsibility of preparing secondary teachers as well as normal school teachers. In 1890 Albany was granted status as a Normal College by the State Board of Regents. It thus became the first normal college in the state.

The Board of Regents decided that in providing a curriculum for training teachers, liberal arts should not be neglected. This combination of liberal arts and teacher training enabled Albany to produce excellent teachers.

Albany was given the right to grant degrees of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees in 1913. For several years it was the only normal college in the state and the privilege of granting these degrees. Since 1928 graduate holding these degrees have been given the same

a solid liberal arts background with the varied learning preparation.

Although Albany was a teaching school, all of the graduates did not have a liberal arts background. The graduates' background of New York at Albany was strong.

Albany was given the power to grant Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees in 1905. For several years it was the only public state college that had the privilege of granting these degrees. Since 1908 graduates holding these degrees have been known to have

a solid liberal arts background with the added teaching preparation.

Although Albany was a teaching school, all of its graduates did not stop at this point. Since the graduate's backgrounds in the arts and sciences were strong, they were able to gain admittance to the various professional schools such as medicine, dentistry, and law.

On April 1, 1949, the New York State College for Teachers became part of the State University system. With the formation of the State University of New York, Albany's administration was placed in the hands of the Trustees of the State University. Ten years later, on September 1, 1959, the Trustees changed the name to State University of New York College of Education at Albany.

Two years later the College of Education became the State University College at Albany. In August of 1962, the name changed again and hopefully for the last time to the State University of New York at Albany, a name which reflects the nature of Albany State.


The State University at Albany is a modern University center. It presently contains several schools within its structure. It has emerged from a pure teaching institution to a university granting Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees. Masters and


Doctorate degrees are also awarded. The State University at Albany is constantly expanding its programs, holding summer sessions and night school as well as the regular sessions.

Aside from its academic distinction, the new campus of the State University at Albany is getting national acclaim. The \$100 million complex was designed by Edward Durell Stone. The plan of the university is based on a centrally located Academic Podium. At each corner of the Podium there is a residence hall complex. Each complex includes a dining hall, eight low rise, three-story units, and a twenty-three story tower. The total number of residents in a quadrangle is approximately 1200. In addition, there is an infirmary with both in-patient and out-patient facilities and a physical education building.

DRAPER HALL

In this building the School of Business was founded. Prior to moving to the New Campus the ivy covered hall was the focal point of the University.






PAGE HALL

Located on the Old Campus, Page Hall houses the University auditorium and gymnasium. Many distinguished artists have been both heard and seen in this hall.




SAYLES HALL

This is an artist's conception of the new campus of the State University of New York at Albany. Completion is expected in 1970. The four dormitory complexes surround the academic podium.




ACADEMIC PODIUM

THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

History:

The State University of New York at Albany was first established as a Normal School or Normal College by the New York State Board of Regents in 1890. In 1904, the college began a curriculum in business. In 1905, the school was empowered to award Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees. For several decades it was the only public state college in New York that was extended this privilege.

The purpose of the curriculum was to prepare students to teach in our public school. In performing this function, the Business Department was established to fulfill the need for business teachers in our secondary schools. The school underwent some changes in name, and in August of 1962, it emerged as a university center within the New York State University complex. The School of Business was established at this time. In September of 1962, the program in business, previously being limited to students preparing for teaching, was opened to students with other educational objectives. At State, the theory of education has always been to provide a liberal arts background along with a highly developed proficiency in one area of concentration. Although the School of Business now provides the business world with a steady flow of highly capable talent, it hasn't neglected its teacher education

role either. In 1963-64 it graduated more business teachers than any other school in the country,, granting 107 bachelor degrees and 34 masters degrees in business education.

Present:

The recent transformation in the New York State University system has brought profound and rapid developments in the programs of the liberal arts, sciences and the professional schools. The School of Business of the State University of New York at Albany is an integral part of this development.

Basic Objectives Of The School Of Business:

1. To provide students with a sound foundation of knowledge and skills for service and leadership in the business world.
2. To develop business educators for secondary and collegiate schools.
3. To conduct research to advance understanding and knowledge of business functions.
4. To provide the business community with a source of specialists on business procedures.
5. To assist the business community through programs of continuing education in keeping up to date with developments in the ever changing economy.

Organization And Programs

The School of Business provides programs leading to undergraduate degrees in several basic areas:

2. BUSINESS AND DISTRIBUTIVE EDUCATION

The Certified Public Accounting Program of the School of Business is registered by the New York State Department of Education.

Faculty

The faculty of the School of Business includes specialists in management, accounting, marketing, office administration, law, business communications, and business and distributive education. They have made significant contributions to business theory and practice through their research and writings.

Business Services

The School of Business is part of the community. Included as part of the services which the School of Business and the University make available to the community are:

1. Seminars and institutes for business men
2. Research in special areas of business
3. Speakers for business groups
4. Consultants

Facilities

The School of Business will be moved to one of the most complete facilities for education in the country when it takes its place on a completely new and greatly expanded university campus in 1967. The new facilities will feature closed circuit television, amphitheaters for large group lectures, and management, marketing, and office machine laboratories, as well as fully-equipped seminar rooms. A modern computer center will supply services which will be a part of many business courses.

The School of Business is presently seeking accreditation by the American Collegiate Schools of Business. When the School of Business enters its new facilities in September, 1967, an application will be submitted. It is anticipated that membership in the American Collegiate Schools of Business may be extended sometime during 1968.

HISTORY OF ALPHA SIGMA UPSILON

In early January, 1966, a group of Delta Sigs on our faculty saw the need for the establishment of a professional business fraternity on our campus to supplement the expanding scope of the Business Department, and the State University of New York at Albany in general. As result, Dr. H. L. Cannon corresponded with Mr. C. Farrar, Executive Director of Delta Sigma Pi, to inform him of their intention and to seek promotional material for this purpose. Mr. Farrar expressed his interest and an ad hoc committee was formed, chaired by Dr. Cannon, and consisting of Dr. M. C. Olson, Dean of the School of Business, Dr. H. Lee, Dr. R. Klages, and Dr. R. Miller of the faculty.

The committee formed a list of all "eligible" students. On March 22, 1966, an informal meeting of interested students and faculty was held. Mr. Gordon Nelson, Vice-President of the State Bank of Albany, and a Delta Sig brother, spoke to the group on the merits of a professional fraternity and of his experiences with Delta Sigma Pi. In late March a nominating committee was selected by the faculty and arrangements

were made for the election of officers to take place at the next meeting of the local group.

At the April meeting a slate of officers was elected; President J. Warner appointed various committees to investigate the professional fraternities Delta Sigma Pi and Alpha Kappa Psi. These committees also worked on our constitution and made arrangements for speakers from both fraternities.

In May, the members of Alpha Sigma Upsilon, after hearing presentations by Mr. John Marko, national president of Delta Sigma Pi, and Mr. Weinheimer of Alpha Kappa Psi, voted to seek affiliation with Delta Sigma Pi, International Business Fraternity. The main office of Delta Sigma Pi was then notified of the intention of Alpha Sigma Upsilon and we were assured full cooperation and assistance of the main office.

During the summer recess, Mr. Marko met with our executive committee. Plans were made for the writing and submission of our petition to Delta Sigma Pi. Tentative plans were made for a fall pledging ceremony to A.S.U. Plans were made for a "rush" picnic in September and A.S.U. sent out its first newsletter announcing the picnic, current developments, and future plans.

In late August all "eligible" students in the School of Business were notified of the rush activity, which was held in early October.

At the first meeting after Thanksgiving vacation, committees were appointed to work on the petition. The members now directed their efforts toward seeking an early affiliation and establishing a full and active program.

On February 15th, John Shamba, Local 301-International Electrical Workers, is going to lecture on the role of the union in modern day business. Mr. M. W. Killigan, a private tax consultant, discusses the topic "The Taxpayer" on March 15th. The brothers will have an opportunity to learn about positions that are available in the life insurance industry when John Farron of the Aetna Life Insurance Company speaks on April 15th. The last professional meeting of the semester occurs on May 17th. Marshall Goldman, Assistant Vice-President of a local Albany bank, will moderate a discussion on "Banking & Finance".


