

Gentlemen:

I am very pleased to write this letter in support of the efforts of the Nu Iota professional business fraternity to receive a charter from the national office of Delta Sigma Pi. It is my understanding that student initiative was the most important factor in activating the Nu Iota Chapter in the first place, and I certainly commend the efforts of students to receive national recognition for their professional interests.

It is probable that charter membership of this group at Northern Illinois University will range from 40 to 60 students enrolled in the College of Business. As you may know, the University has a very substantial number of students with majors in this College, the number of undergraduates in the fall semester of 1967 being 2,687. The plans of the students sponsoring this professional business fraternity at Northern Illinois University would appear to meet what I understand to be the goals and objectives of Delta Sigma Pi. There is planned a visitation table where students who are as yet undecided as to major or who are in the process of changing their majors may be advised by members of the fraternity before registration in the fall and spring semesters and also during the summer months. In addition, members of this group have already begun plans for a career opportunity day during the course of the academic year where representatives from business and industrial firms may acquaint prospective graduates with opportunities in their companies.

The group is planning a coffee hour to bring students enrolled in the College of Business and the faculty of that College together at the beginning of each semester. Field trips involving visitation to business and industrial firms in the area are also planned as well as banquet programs featuring speakers with particular expertise in the business field.

The requirements for membership in the chapter have been developed as follows:

- 1. A student must have a declared major within the College of Business or within the Department of Economics.
- 2. A student must have completed 15 hours of college courses at Northern Illinois University.

- The applicant must have achieved a 2.6 cumulative grade point average on all work within the College of Business or the Department of Economics (based on a 4.0 scale.)
- 4. Each applicant for membership will be interviewed by a committee to ascertain his seriousness of purpose and his professional interests in the field of business.

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# STRUCTURE AND BACKGROUND OF THE UNIVERSITY

#### THE UNIVERSITY TODAY

#### **Location and Governance**

Northern Illinois University, located at DeKalb, 65 miles due west of Chicago's Loop, and Illinois State University comprise the Regency System of multi-purpose institutions of public higher education. This system was established in 1967 by the Illinois General Assembly in accordance with the Master Plan for Public Higher Education, Phase II. The Universities comprising the system are governed by the Board of Regents—nine members appointed by the Governor for six-year terms and the superintendent of public instruction, ex-officio. The Regents serve without remuneration.

#### Organization

The University comprises the following divisions:

- 1. The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences
- 2. The College of Fine and Applied Arts
- 3. The College of Education
- 4. The College of Business
- 5. The College of Continuing Education
- 6. The Graduate School

#### Accreditation

All of the degree programs of the University from baccalaureate through doctorate are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The professional education degrees of the University are accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.

The University and its colleges have institutional membership or other affiliations in or with the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education, American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers, American Association of Junior Colleges, American Association of School Administrators, American Association of University Women, American Council on Education, Association of American Colleges, Association of College Admissions Counselors, Association for Higher Education, Association of State Colleges and Universities, Association of University Evening Colleges, Association of Urban Universities, Council of Graduate Schools in the United States, Institute of International Education, Inc., Inter-University Committee on the Superior Student, Mid-West Conference on Graduate Study and Research, Midwest Program on Airborne Television Instruction, National Association for Business Teacher Education, National League for Nursing, and the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

#### DEVELOPMENT AND GROWTH Background

During the first 55 years of its history, Northern Illinois University grew modestly and slowly. Since 1950, however, the University has been developing its programs, curricula, faculty, library resources, research facilities and physical plant as rapidly as its commitment to excellence will permit. Even so, it has not been possible for the University to enlarge and diversify at a rate which would allow it to keep pace with the phenomenal growth in population or with the expansion of industry, commerce, and agriculture in northern Illinois. Thus, the decades ahead offer the prospect of still greater opportunities and challenges.

The remarkable growth in the number of junior colleges in the state, a result of the Illinois Master Plan for Higher Education, as well as the accelerating increase in college attendance, will impose diverse and important additional obligations upon all of the colleges in the University and, especially, upon its Graduate School. The institution is in the process of expanding and strengthening its upper division and graduate programs, its library and research facilities, and its faculty. The University recognizes and welcomes its unparalleled opportunity to make increasingly significant contributions to society and to higher education, on a national as well as on a regional and state basis. The following facts afford some impression of the evolution of the University:

- 1958: NORTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY Master of Arts Master of Science Master of Music Master of Fine Arts
- 1962: Doctor of Philosophy: History and English Doctor of Education: Business Education and Education
- 1964: Bachelor of Music
- 1966: Doctor of Philosophy: Chemistry and Psychology
- 1967: Bachelor of Fine Arts

A substantial number of other departments are building their facilities, library collections, and faculties in preparation for offering the doctorate in the near future. In the northern sector of the state, requirements are continually increasing for better educated, more fully qualified researchers, teachers, engineers, librarians, executives, and other leaders. Hence, the University will have to assume responsibility for offering advanced programs in additional areas.

#### Grading System

The unit of credit is expressed in semester hours. A semester hour means a subject pursued one period a week for eighteen weeks. A student may accumulate "honor points" based on the grades earned. The grades and their honor point values are as follows:

A, B, C, and D are recorded for credit courses for which the student has been given a passing mark.

An F is recorded when:

- 1. A student fails to make a passing mark in a course for which he has registered.
- 2. A student drops a course without official permission.
- 3. A student drops a course with official permission but is not doing passing work at the time.
- 4. A student is not doing passing work at the time of withdrawal from the University.

#### Scholastic Standard

The scholastic standing of all students is computed on the basis of courses attempted at this university only. For determining scholarship rank and the awarding of honors, the honor point system is used. The honor point average is the quotient obtained by dividing the total number of honor points earned by the total number of hours attempted (*i.e.*, those for which grades of A, B, C, D, or F are recorded). Students are not permitted to repeat for credit any course or courses in which they have already received a passing grade.

#### **Classification of Students**

Students are classified as follows: freshmen are those students having less than 30 semester hours of credit; sophomores, those with 30 or more semester hours, but less than 60; juniors, those with 60 or more, but less than 90; seniors, those with 90 or more.

#### Scholastic Load

The normal class load for undergraduate students is from 14 to 18 semester hours each semester. Students in their first semester of residence at the University may not carry more than 18 semester hours of work. Non-credit courses and audit courses are considered a part of the class load.

Students who have established superior scholastic records in the University may petition for permission to take up to a maximum of 21 semester hours of work during the semester.

# **REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION IN ALL CURRICULA**

### **General Education Requirements**

"A liberal education . . . is the education which gives a man a clear, conscious view of his own opinions and judgments, a truth in developing them, an eloquence in expressing them, and a force in urging them."

The General Education section of a student's undergraduate program is especially designed to contribute to liberal education as defined above by John Henry Newman. This definition is particularly relevant to the purposes which underlie the courses in communication as they appear below.

The undergraduate degree programs have established the following purposes for the other areas of General Education:

*Humanities*: To expand the student's understanding and appreciation of and experience in the arts; to aid the student in developing a satisfying personal philosophy.

Sciences and Mathematics: To show the use of, and to give an appreciation of, the scientific method of inquiry; to impart scientific facts and principles pertaining to the physical and biological world and an understanding of their implications for human welfare and survival.

Social Sciences: To provide knowledge in its historical perspective as a means of preparing students to make intelligent decisions and take intelligent action in matters of social policy.

# Other Requirements for Graduation

In addition to meeting the General Education requirements listed above, all candidates for baccalaureate degrees (Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Education, and Bachelor of Music) must satisfy the following requirements:

They must earn a minimum of 124 semester hours of credit (including 40 semester hours in senior college courses) with a cumulative grade average of "C" in all credit earned and an average of "C" in the major field. Not more than 30 semester hours may be taken in extension classes and/or by correspondence.

They must earn 30 semester hours in residence while classified as juniors and/or seniors.

They must satisfy the major requirements as given under the listings of their respective departments. Except in instances of a comprehensive major, or a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, they are also required to select a minor area of study.

Students who make a grade of "D" in English 103 in this university (or in the equivalent to English 103 at another institution) are required to take and pass a Proficiency Examination in written English. Normally this examination will be given once each term, on the second Tuesday of November, April, and July. Time and place of the examination are announced in the University Calendar. The examination may be taken during the sophomore or junior year only. A student who has not passed the examination by the end of his junior year (that is, before he completes 90 semester hours of work) will not be permitted to register for further courses in the University. A student may take this examination no more than three times.

Transfer students who enter as juniors and who earned a "D" in English 103 (or in the course equivalent to English 103) may also take the examination three times during the regular time in November and April of their junior year, as well as in September of their junior year upon special request of the English Department. As with students who enter as freshmen, if such a student has not passed the examination by the end of his junior year (that is, before he completes 90 semester hours of work), he will not be permitted to register for further courses at Northern Illinois University.

Students who fail the examination are expected to attend the Writing Clinic regularly. Until they have passed the examination they will be permitted to carry a course load of no more than 14 semester hours so that they can handle this extra responsibility.

All students must meet the requirements of Senate Bill Number 195 of the 68th General Assembly of the State of Illinois. In brief, this law requires a knowledge of the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the proper use and display of the American flag. This requirement may be satisfied by passing Political Science 140 Introduction to American Government and Politics or by satisfactorily completing the Test for Senate Bill 195.

# Special Requirements for the Degree Bachelor of Arts

A candidate for the Bachelor of Arts degree must demonstrate a proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to that attained upon completion of two years of college instruction in that language. Alternatives for meeting this requirement are:

- 1. Achieving a passing grade in the second semester of the second college year of instruction in a foreign language.
- 2. Achieving a passing grade in any credit course above the second college year level in a foreign language.
- 3. Successful completion of an exemption examination in a foreign language offered by the Department of Foreign Languages.

Students with four years of high school foreign language instruction should meet this requirement by Alternative 2 or 3, but may elect Alternative 1, *without credit*. Students with less than four years of high school instruction should meet this requirement by Alternative 1, with appropriate election, competency and placement advice.



The departments of the College of Business offer four-year programs leading to the degrees Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Science in Education.




Course work for the above degrees in business is provided through the following departments:



**McMurry Hall** (opened-1911) is located on the East Campus, slightly northeast of Altgeld Hall. Named for Charles Alexander McMurry, first Director of the Practice Department, and Lida B. McMurry, early member of that department, it formerly housed the campus elementary school; it has been remodeled to supply classroom and office space for the College of Business.







Wirtz Hall (completed-1964) is located on East Campus, north of McMurry Hall, to which it is connected by corridors. Named for William Wilbur Wirtz, former faculty member and former chairman of the Teachers College Board, it contains classrooms, laboratories, and offices for the Home Economics Department and the College of Business.

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

#### AT NORTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

#### Summary

The departments of business at Northern Illinois University started as a Department of Business Education in 1951. A steady increase in enrollments was experienced during the first four years. In 1955, a policy decision made it possible to offer a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. The rate of increase from 1955 to 1958 was greater than it was for the first four years. These enrollment increases were general for the entire university as well as the department of business, but the rate of growth was greater for the departments of business.

Curriculum changes were made each year. New staff members were added to accommodate the changes in the curriculum and the increased enrollments until a total of eighteen were employed in 1958. The major curriculum change occurred in 1955 when business administration options were organized.

Several administration changes have taken place during the history of the departments. Dr. F. R. Geigle, who organized the original Business Education Department, was appointed administrative assistant to the President during the summer of 1954. Dr. R. L. Thistlethwaite then served as department head until the first semester of 1957, when he became associate dean of instruction. Dr. C. M. File was appointed acting head of the Department of Business in 1957.

A major change in organization was made at the start of the school year 1959-1960, when the Department of Business Administration. Dr. Lyle Maxwell was appointed head of the Department of Business Administration and Dr. File was named head of the Department of Business Administration.

At the start of the school year 1958-1959, the Business Department moved into Mc Murry Hall where the physical requirements of an expanding department were more adequately met.

In September, 1961, the College of Business was created with four departments: Business Education, Accounting, Management and Fimance, and Marketing. Dr. R. L. Thistlethwaite returned to the area of business as Dean of the College. In September, 1963, Management and Finance was divided into two departments.

In 1964, the college enlarged its facilities by moving most offices and classes to the new Wirtz building.

The departments as of September, 1965, are headed by: Dr. Clarence Avery in Accountancy; Dr. Lyle Maxwell in Business Education; Dr. George Bishop in Finance; Dr. Lawrence Hackamack in Management; and Dr. Richard Howland in Marketing.

In the short span of sixteen years the College of Business has produced 3,198 graduates ranging from bachelor's degree to the doctorate.

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#### UNDERGRADUATE PURPOSES OF COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

#### 1. College of Business -- Departments of Business Education, Accountancy, Finance, Management, and Marketing

The College of Business provides a program of professional and content courses necessary to develop the capacity of its students to make sound judgments and decisions based upon business principles and knowledge of the business world.

Within this common objective the College attempts to satisfy the needs of two groups of students: those men and women who are preparing for various roles in all types of business, and those men and women who are preparing to teach business at the several educational levels.

a. Business Administration<sup>1</sup>

#### OBJECTIVES

- To inculcate an awareness of ethical considerations as an integral factor in business decisions.
- To lead students to a recognition of the need for an integrated economic and social philosophy.

- IMPLEMENTATION
- a) Emphasizing ethical considerations in all business courses.
- b) Showing relationships between good business and ethical practices.
- a) Offering courses concerned with basic economic and business principles, with emphasis on businesses in their socialeconomic environment.
- b) Familiarizing students with the basic theory and philosophy underlying the private enterprise system.
- To help students to arrive at an understanding of business functions and of their interrelationships.
- a) Introducing students to and familiarizing them with generally accepted principles of accounting, finance, management, industrial

- 4) To help students to arrive at an understanding of organizational structure in business and of individual and group behavior within organizations.
- 5) To impart a knowledge of the techniques of measuring and analyzing business results and of sources of business information.

- To assist students to achieve proficiency in oral and written communication.
- 7) To acquaint students with the principles and competencies in each of the functional areas of business as an intellectual discipline, and to determine that students become proficient in a special field.

- a) (continued) relations, and their interrelationships.
- b) Providing field trips, internships, and actual business research.
- c) Bringing functions and relationships together in a course in the senior year: <u>Business Policies</u>.
- a) Encouraging student participation in extra-curricular activities, especially those relating to business.
- b) Presenting psychological and behavioral problems in appropriate courses.
- a) Giving students a sound foundation in business mathematics.
- b) Giving students a thorough foundation in the techniques of measurement.
- c) Offering specific courses in business statistics, quantitative analysis, business forecasting, managerial accounting, and controllership.
- a) Offering specialized courses in business communications.
- b) Stressing good business communications in all courses.
- a) Offering problem-solving courses in Business Administration, geared to increasing competence of the students in the functional areas of business.
- b) Emphasizing disciplinary courses such as law, economics, public control of business, human behavior and management.
- c) Requiring students to complete 24 to 26 hours in a specialty.

b. Business Education

#### OBJECTIVES

 To provide the special professional education and business courses necessary to educate business teachers for positions in the secondary schools (junior and senior high schools).

#### IMPLEMENTATION

 a) Presenting a curriculum for the beginning business teacher which compares with recommendation of the National Association for Business Teacher Education as follows:

- b) Providing an appropriate balance of courses in skill development, in business and economic understanding, and in methods of teaching.
- c) Supervising business education student teachers.
- To provide curricula for the education of administrative secretaries and other office workers.
- 3) To offer service courses which will contribute to the general and special education of the students in the College of Business and in the University, e.g., typewriting and consumer economics.
- To provide in-service and adult education programs for various groups upon request.
- 5) To provide leadership in improving the curriculum and the teaching in the secondary schools and in developing closer relations between the schools and business.

Offering courses designed to meet the special needs of office workers. (Please see the current Undergraduate Catalog.)

Offering courses open to all university students and, in addition, in cooperation with the Speech Department, making courses available for handicapped--especially Hard-of-hearing people. Consumer Economics is especially in demand as an elective by elementary school teachers.

Offering courses for professional secretaries. (CPA Review courses are offered on demand.)



THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS and the Home Economics Department occupy Wirtz Hall, a new \$1,750,000 NIU building which contains almost 50,000 square feet of space.

Wirtz Hall, a precast concrete structure, is named after William Wilbur Wirtz, DeKalb business and civic leader, former chairman of the State Teachers College Board and father of Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz. Visitors to the new structure will immediately see the three-story light court in the building's center. It is designed to light offices and classrooms and assist with traffic flow. The court's roof is a double layer of translucent fiberglass panels.

Approximately three-fifths of the building is occupied by Business and two-fifths by Home Economics.

Business also has space in McMurry Hall. McMurry and Wirtz are joined by enclosed corridors. A feature of Wirtz is a 262-seat auditorium, Northern's first with fixed tables as well as chairs for the audience. There is a blackboard on stage as well as an electrically-lowered movie screen. Also, there are small dress-ing rooms for style show participants and conference speakers.

A sound system will permit lectures to be "piped" to students in the light court and in a 90-seat large classroom directly across the court from the auditorium. Business has office space in Wirtz for all its five departments and seventeen classrooms for business classes, including rooms for typing, shorthand, office machines practice, a multiple channel dictation room, and seminar rooms. Some of these classrooms and seminar rooms can be split by folding doors to create extra classrooms.

Altgeld Hall (completed-1897) is located on the East Campus. Named for John Peter Altgeld, Governor of Illinois when Northern was established, it contains administrative and business offices, an auditorium with seating for 925, classrooms, and offices for faculty members.






**Graham Hall** (completed-1964) is located on Central Campus, west of the University School, to which it is joined by a covered walkway. Named for Ray Graham, former State Director of Exceptional Children, it accommodates a maximum of seventy-five handicapped children who aid in the instruction of special education teachers. It also houses the Reading Clinic and contains classrooms and offices of the Education Departments. **Still Gymnasium** (dedicated-1928) is located on the East Campus, east of Altgeld Hall. Named for Edgar B. Still, a former resident member of the Teachers College Board, this building is used for offices for faculty members.

Industry and Technology Building (dedicated-1928) is located on the East Campus, east of Altgeld Hall. Also named for Mr. Still, this building contains offices; classrooms; laboratories for graphic arts, woods, metals, electricity and electronics, technical drawing, silversmithing and crafts, and industrial arts activities for elementary teachers; and facilities for safety and driver education. Additional laboratories being developed are materials testing, instrumentation, industrial production illustration, and power mechanics.








**Home Management House** (acquired-1960) is located on the northwest corner of Normal Road and College Avenue. It is used by the Home Economics Department as a home for the seniors who wish to satisfy the requirement of high schools which employ vocational home economics teachers: residence in a home furnished in a way that makes for wider experience in, or greater appreciation of, the many phases of successful homemaking. **Williston Hall** (dedicated-1915) is located on East Campus, to the northwest of Altgeld Hall. Named for John Williston Cook, first President of Northern, it houses 177 women.

**Gilbert Hall** (opened-1952) is located on East Campus, to the east of Wirtz Hall. Named for Newell D. Gilbert, one of the first members of the faculty at Northern and coordinator of student teaching in the city schools, it houses 366 men. Neptune Residence Hall Complex is located at the northeast corner of Central Campus. Named for Celine Neptune, a former Head of the Department of Home Economics, it consists of four units: Neptune North Residence Hall (dedicated-1955), Neptune West Residence Hall (opened-1959), Neptune East Residence Hall (opened-1960), and Neptune Central Dining Hall (opened-1960). It houses 1,182 women.

**University Apartments** (dedicated-1960) is located on the West Campus, to the north of Abraham Lincoln Residence Hall. It comprises forty modern efficiency apartments and forty one-bedroom apartments, all completely furnished for married students.



**West Stadium and Teaching Gymnasium** (completed 1965-66) is located on the West Campus, southwest of Douglas. The west stands will seat fifteen thousand. The teaching gymnasiums are under the stands. Eventually the stadium will have approximately fifty thousand seats when the east stands and the ends of the bowl are built.

#### Lorado Taft Field Campus

The Lorado Taft Field Campus, covering 140 acres, is located approximately 35 miles west of DeKalb near the city of Oregon. This branch campus, adjacent to the Lowden Memorial State Park, is situated in a hilly and heavily wooded area on the east side of the Rock River, which was formerly the site of Eagle's Nest Art Association. The buildings in this secnic area have been completely rehabilitated and are now equipped for year-round use. The area is ideal for practical natural laboratory work. Here students have an opportunity to study various aspects of outdoor educational activities not available in the traditional classroom.

The Taft Campus is used during the regular school year for direct experiences in outdoor education for all Elementary Education majors and other University classes. It is also made available to public school systems which wish to give their students and teachers an opportunity to use the out-of-doors in the educational program of children. Student teachers work with the elementary school groups on a 24 hour a day basis while they are living at the field campus.

Graduate and undergraduate courses offered at the Lorado Taft Field Campus during summer sessions confer residence credit.

Overlooking the river is spacious **Poley Hall**, which houses a classroom and faculty offices.

**Taft House**, the former home of the famous sculptor Lorado Taft, has a comfortable lounge room and offices. These rooms are used for conference purposes.

**Harrison Dining Hall**, on a bluff overlooking the Rock River, has walls of glass on three sides to take advantage of the view.

Other buildings, not pictured, are as follows: The **Browne House** has been converted into a clinic and comfortable, well-equipped bunk house for 20 persons. The **Dickerson House** has been completely rebuilt and equipped to house 22 persons. **Grover House**, a multipurpose building, contains two classrooms and sleeps 30.

**Clarkson Hall**, a dormitory housing 56, is named for Ralph Clarkson, last trustee and teacher of Lorado Taft's art colony. A research laboratory and instructional materials center are located in the lower level of Clarkson House.

#### FOUNDING MEETING OF

#### NU IOTA

PLACE: Wirtz Hall, Marketing Lounge, December 12, 1967

The original meeting of what is now Nu Iota professional business fraternity was opened with a presentation of the objectives as to the formation of Nu Iota, the election of officers and the petitioning to Delta Sigma Pi national business fraternity for admission into its ranks. This presentation was given by members of the Steering Committee who were Chairman Joseph Stawicki, John Terrell, James Le Pere, Charles Hofbauer and Carl Chizewski.

Originally the name Nu Iota Upsilon was suggested as the name for the fraternity by the Steering Committee, however, a vote was taken and passed to establish this professional business fraternity, which is under the jurisdiction of the Student Activity Board, as Nu Iota.

The members heard alumni members of Delta Sigma Pi from Loyola University, Marquette University, and Indiana University as well as an active member of the Marquette chapter. They discussed the role Delta Sigma Pi played on their campus and what Delta Sigma Pi meant to them.

The officers that were elected for Nu Iota are: President, Charles Hofbauer; Secretary, Robert Bell; Treasurer, Robert Paul; Constitution Committe Chairman, David Salch; and Membership Committee Chairman, William Mitchell. After the election a vote was taken and approved to disband the steering committee.

It was voted on and unanimously accepted that Dr. Robert Judd and Dr. Michael Del Fra would be our faculty advisors. Proxy rights were granted to the officers to establish and approve a constitution, which was done at a meeting December 13, 1967. 



### CONSTITUTION

#### PREAMBLE

Delta Sigma Pi is a professional fraternity organized to foster the study of business in universities; to encourage scholarship, social activity and the association of students for their mutual advancement by research and practice; to promote closer affiliation between the commercial world and students of commerce, and to further a higher standard of commercial ethics and culture and the civic and commercial welfare of the community.

#### ARTICLE I

#### NAME

This chapter shall be officially known and designated as the .....\* Chapter of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi.

#### ARTICLE II

## ORGANIZATION AND GOVERNMENT

Section 1. The laws of this chapter shall consist of the Ritual, the Constitution, the Bylaws of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, the Interim Edicts of the Grand Council, the Resolutions of the Grand Chapter Congress in the form of a statutory code, such additional regulations as may be enacted by the Grand Chapter or the Grand Council, and these Bylaws.

Section 2. This chapter may also pass rules and regulations for local government from time to time, not inconsistent with the laws of this fraternity. They shall be typewritten in duplicate, and presented for review and approval by the Grand Council of the fraternity through the office of the Executive Director. All proposed amendments shall be submitted in advance for review and approval by the Grand Council and do not become effective until so approved.

Section 3. This chapter shall consist of all members initiated by or affiliated with the chapter, who are in good standing and who are attending the Northern Illinois University's School of Business or Economics, or pursuing pre-business and pre-economics subjects. Section 4. The Executive Committee of this chapter shall consist of the President, Senior Vice President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 5. This chapter shall be represented legally as the .....\* Chapter of Delta Sigma Pi, incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois, as a corporation not for pecuniary profit.

#### ARTICLE III

## MEMBERSHIP, ELECTION AND INITIATION

Section 1. The membership of ..... \* Chapter shall consist of three classes; active, honorary, and alumni.

Section 2. Only those male students regularly enrolled in the Northern Illinois University, School of Business or Economics, or pursuing pre-business or pre-economics subjects; of good moral character; who comply with the Ritual and Laws of this fraternity shall be eligible to election in this fraternity as an active member, providing they are not members of any other fraternity in direct competition with this fraternity. No one may be initiated into this chapter until he has acquired a minimum of 15 hours of university credit, with a scholastic average of at least 2.5 in the major field of study.

Section 3. Membership in this chapter shall not be granted to any man who is a member of any local, national, or international professional commerce and business administration fraternity in competition with this fraternity. No members of this fraternity may become members of any other professional commerce and business administration fraternity, and should a member become so, he shall upon such action be automatically expelled from this fraternity without regard to any due process of jurisprudence we find in the Constitution and Bylaws of the fraternity.

Section 4. Honorary members shall be those men who are duly elected by this chapter and approved by the Grand Council of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, but who, at the time of initiation, are not students nor faculty members at Northern Illinois University.

Section 5. Members of the faculty of Northern Illinois University, School of Business or Economics, may be initiated into active membership by .....\* Chapter, upon being duly elected by this chapter, and approved by the Grand Council of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi. Immediately after initiation such members shall sssume the status of alumni.

Section 6. Alumni shall be those who were active members in good standing of .....\* Chapter, but who have graduated from, or who have ceased to pursue regular courses in the School of Business or Economics of Northern Illinois University.

Section 7. Every member of this chapter, regardless of classification, must be initiated in due form, according to the Ritual of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, and shall take the entire oath of allegiance as provided for therein.

Section 8. Any member of Delta Sigma Pi in good standing, who transfers to Northern Illinois University and registers in the School of Business or Economics, may affiliate with this chapter providing a formal application is made to this chapter and an approval of the majority of the members of this active chapter is secured. This application must have accompanying it a letter from some officer of the applicant's chapter certifying to the fact that the member was in good standing.

Section 9. All elections to membership, except for affiliation in this chapter shall be by secret ballot. A unanimous vote of all active members of the chapter present and in good standing shall be required. To insure against mistake, should three or less negative votes appear in the ballot box on the name of a candidate for membership, a second ballot shall be immediately taken. Should the name of a candidate be rejected by this chapter, the same shall not be proposed again for a period of four months from the date of rejection. Should the name of the same candidate be proposed and rejected a second time by this chapter, the same shall not be proposed again for one year from the date of rejection. Should the name of the same candidate be proposed and rejected a third time, the same shall never be proposed in this chapter.

Section 10. All candidates who have been elected to membership in this chapter shall be pledged in accordance with the Ritual requirements of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi. A pledge may be revoked by a majority vote of the active members of this chapter in good standing, present and voting, at any regular meeting of this chapter.

Section 11. After pledging, a probationary period of not less than 45 days shall follow. During this time the pledge shall be under the supervision and direction of the Vice President. The pledge shall perform such duties and enjoy such rights as may be prescribed by this chapter.

Section 12. A pledge's withdrawal from the School of Business or Economics shall automatically cancel his pledge.

Section 13. Membership in Delta Sigma Pi is for life, and the Ritual and Laws of this fraternity and this chapter do not recognize or permit resignations.

#### ARTICLE IV

### FINANCES

Section 1. The initiation fee to be paid by each active member of this chapter shall be \$50.00 and includes national initiation fees and an official gold badge. This fee shall preferably be paid in equal installments of \$25.00. No pledge shall be initiated by this chapter until he has paid his entire initiation fee in full and has fulfilled all of his other financial obligations to the satisfaction of this chapter.

Section 2. The initiation fee to be paid by each member of the faculty initiated by this chapter shall be \$10.00 which is the national initiation fee. This does not include a gold badge which is optional.

Section 3. A national initiation fee of \$10.00 shall be paid by this chapter for all honorary members initiated by this chapter. No fees are to be collected from the initiate.

Section 4. The chapter dues to be paid by all active members of this chapter shall be \$15.00 to be paid on or before October 31 in the first semester and March 15 in the second semester.

Section 5. The fiscal year of this chapter shall commence on the first day of July and expire on the thirtieth day of June.

Section 6. This chapter shall maintain a checking account in the name of this chapter. All receipts of the chapter shall be deposited in this account, and all disbursements of this chapter shall be made from this account. All checks shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the Chapter Advisor.

Section 7. This chapter shall use the standard accounting system of Delta Sigma Pi as supplied by The Central Office of the fraternity.

Section 8. The Treasurer of this chapter shall be under a fidelity bond of at least \$2,500.00, which bond shall be taken out by the Executive Director and the cost of same paid for by this chapter.

### ARTICLE V

#### MEETINGS AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Regular stated meetings of this chapter shall be held on the First and Third Thursdays of each month, at the hour of 8:40 p.m., the place to be announced.

Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the President or the Executive Committee by giving five days notice to all active members.

Section 3. A majority of the active members in good standing shall constitute a quorum for any stated or special meeting of this chapter.

Section 4. The order of business at all stated or special meetings shall be as follows:

- 1. Opening of meeting according to ritual
- 2. Roll call
- 3. Reading of minutes of previous meeting
- 4. Old business
- 5. Nominations for membership
- 6. Balloting
- 7. Committee reports
- 8. New business
- 9. Remarks for the good of the chapter
- 10. Adjournment of meeting according to ritual

Section 5. The election of officers of this chapter shall be held at the first business meeting in May.

Section 6. All active members in good standing shall be notified by mail of the date, time and place of holding the election of officers, at least 10 days prior thereto.

Section 7. In the election of chapter officers, the member receiving the greatest number of votes for the office in question shall be declared elected. The officers of this chapter must not be on probation by the university or in arrears for more than 30 days for any chapter liability. If after nomination or election, any member temporarily or permanently withdraws from the School of Business or Economics, or is placed on probation by the university, or becomes in arrears for more than 30 days for any chapter liability of any kind whatsoever, he shall be automatically disqualified for office in this chapter and a successor shall be immediately elected or appointed to fill the vacancy thereby created.

Section 8. Except as otherwise provided for in these bylaws, all meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order.

#### ARTICLE VI

### OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1. The elective officers of this chapter shall be the President, Senior Vice President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chancellor, Historian and Chapter Advisor. The President may appoint such other officers or committee chairman as he shall deem necessary.

Section 2. All elective officers shall hold office for a period of one (1) year and/or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Section 4. A petition of one-third of the active members shall be necessary to have the question of removing an officer put before the next regular meeting of this chapter for discussion and vote. A two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at that regular meeting of this chapter shall be required to remove the officer from his office.

Section 5. In the absence of the President, the next highest ranking officer present may call the meeting to order and preside at such meeting.

Section 6. The president shall be executive officer of the undergraduate chapter. He shall have the power to call special meetings in accordance with the Bylaws; to see that all officers of the chapter discharge their duties impartially, accurately, faithfully, and promptly, and shall enforce the strict observance of the Laws of the fraternity. He shall have the power to appoint such officers and committees as provided for in these Bylaws; to cast a deciding vote in case of ties; to sign all certificates of membership; and have such other duties as may be prescribed in the Laws of the fraternity.

Section 7. The Senior Vice-President shall assist the President in the performance of his duties. He shall succeed to the powers and duties of the President in the temporary absence or disability of the latter. He shall have charge of the investigation and pledging of candidates for membership; and all other duties as may be prescribed in the Laws of the fraternity.

Section 8. The Vice President shall assist the Senior Vice-President in the performance of his duties. He shall succeed to the powers of the Senior Vice-President in the temporary absence or disability of the latter. He shall have charge of the preparation of pledges for examination and initiation; and perform such other duties as may be prescribed in the Laws of the fraternity.

Section 9. The Treasurer shall receive and expend all moneys of the chapter, and shall keep an accurate account of the same in the Standard Accounting System provided by The Central Office. He shall sign all checks issued by the chapter, and forward such reports as may be required by The Central Office. He shall issue a Certificate of Good Standing to each member of the chapter upon graduation or withdrawal from college.

Section 10. The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings of the chapter, read all official communications into the minutes, handle promptly all correspondence, and sign all membership forms and certificates for all new initiates.

Section 11. The Chancellor shall be the chief judical officer of the chapter. He shall preside over all meetings and trials conducted by the chapter. He shall have no penal rights whatsoever, but he shall report any violations of the Laws of the fraternity to The Central Office. Section 12. The Historian shall keep all historical records of the chapter.

Section 13. The Chapter Advisor shall be an alumni member, life member, or honorary member of the fraternity, and shall be elected by the chapter to serve in an advisory capacity to the chapter, and he shall countersign all checks issued by this fraternity.

### ARTICLE VII

#### COMMITTEES AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1. The Executive Committee of this chapter shall consist of the President, Senior Vice President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The President shall be the chairman of this committee. This committee shall act as a committee on finance and policies.

Section 2. All other committees shall be appointed by the President and their duties determined by him.

Section 3. The Pledging Committee shall consist of not less than three members with the Senior Vice President acting as Chairman. It shall be the duty of this committee to actively attend to and supervise all investigations of prospective members, such as:

- 1. To secure the names of all prospects
- 2. Obtain the scholastic standing of prospects
- 3. To secure information pertaining to the history
  - of these prospects, both on and off the campus
- 4. To invite prospects to rushing parties
- 5. To pledge prospects according to the ritual.

Section 4. The Scholarship Committee shall consist of not less than three members. It shall be the duty of this committee to gather all grades of each of the active members of the fraternity, to compile and determine both individual and chapter averages for each semester, and to make such other reports as may be required. Copies of all such reports shall be mailed to The Central Office of Delta Sigma Pi, and also to the Chapter Advisor.

Section 5. The Professional Committee shall consist of not less than three members. It shall arrange for all professional meetings of the chapter, secure speakers, and carry out the professional program of the chapter, and to make such reports as may be required.

Section 6. The Social Committee shall consist of not less than three members. It shall be the duty of this committee to supervise all of the social activities of the chapter, such as banquets, dinners, luncheons, parties, dances, etc., and to make such reports as may be required.

Section 7. The Nominations Committee shall consist of five members, four of whom are elected by the chapter and the fifth being the chapter president who shall be the chairman. It shall be the duty of this committee to closely examine the record of all active members and to submit a report before the annual meeting recommending one or more qualified nominees for each office. Additional nominations may be made from the floor by any member of the chapter in good standing.

Section 8. The Chapter Efficiency Index Committee shall consist of not less than three members. It shall be the duty of this committee to encourage and promote the successful development of all chapter activities so that the chapter will rank as high as possible in the annual Chapter Efficiency Index, and shall report to The Central Office on Form "C" all points earned by the chapter each month.

### ARTICLE VIII

## PUBLICATIONS AND PUBLICITY

Section 1. The chapter news letter of this chapter shall be known as and shall be issued at least once every semester. Copies of this news letter shall be mailed to The Central Office, the Grand Council, other chapters, and to all active and alumni members of this chapter.

Section 2. The chapter letter and other material for publication in The DELTASIG shall be prepared and regularly mailed to the editor of The DELTASIG by the Deltasig Correspondent.

Section 3. All publicity pertaining to this chapter and to its members, appearing in campus or other publications shall be clipped and kept in an appropriate scrapbook by the Historian.

#### ARTICLE IX

### DISCIPLINE

Section 1. Any member of this chapter may be disciplined in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi. A notice of at least seven days shall be given for any trial, and upon the termination of a trial the Secretary shall prepare a typewritten report of the proceedings of the trial and shall forward this to The Central Office.

### ARTICLE X

### FOUNDERS' DAY AND CHAPTER BIRTHDAY

Appropriate ceremonies shall be held by this chapter on November 7 of each year, or as near thereto as possible, to commemorate the founding of the International Fraternity of Delta Sigma Pi, and on \*\*, or as near thereto as possible, to celebrate the installation of this chapter.

### ARTICLE XI

### AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be repealed, modified, altered, or amended, or new Bylaws adopted at any stated or special meeting of this chapter, provided that due notice by mail of the proposed changes shall have been sent to all active members of this chapter at least ten days preceding the date of said meeting. All proposed amendments to these Bylaws shall be submitted in advance for review and approval by the Grand Council of the fraternity through the office of the Executive Director, and do not become effective until they are so approved.
