

LOCATION

Wayne, located in the northeast corner of Wayne County, is 45 miles southeast of Sioux City, Iowa, and 105 miles northwest of Omaha. With respect to the Interstate Highway System, it is approximately 45 miles west of the Sioux City to Council Bluffs section of Interstate 80. Wayne is 1,457 feet above sea level, and occupies one square mile. The population is approximately 5,000 people. Wayne is located in a part of the state the topography of which could be described as rolling land.

GOVERNMENT

Since its beginning in the early 1880's Wayne has held to the council - mayor form of city government. Among the functions included in its present government are a Street Department, a Park and Recreation Board and a City Attorney. All offices are located in the city hall.

CHURCHES

Six denominations are represented in Wayne, the largest in numbers being Lutheran. There are two Methodist churches and one each of the following: Baptist, Catholic, Presbyterian, Church of Christ, and Assembly of God.

HEALTH FACILITIES

There is one public hospital located within the city. Also, there is a private clinic staffed by two physicians and surgeons. Public health services include a hospital clinic, matron clinic, and a dental clinic. Each clinic is operated with trained technicians.

RECREATION

There are five public parks in the community including playgrounds and picnic areas. A new municipal swimming pool has recently been constructed with an adjoining tennis court. Golf tournaments are held at a new 9-hole golf course. An additional nine holes are scheduled for completion within the current year. Pheasant hunting provides excellent sport for hunters in the surrounding area. A thorough athletic program is provided at both the High School and the College. Wayne is noted for its community support while excelling in all sports.

AGRICULTURE

Wayne County has an economy which is dominated by agriculture, particularly livestock and livestock products. The city of Wayne is located but 20 miles from the center of the largest beef producing county in the world. Two rail-ways, the Chicago and the Northwestern, intersect in Wayne, providing for imports and exports. Being located in the great Corn Belt of the Midwest, the Wayne area is also a leading corn producer.

A HISTORY  
OF  
WAYNE STATE COLLEGE

Wayne State College was established in 1909 when the State Legislature authorized the purchase of the property, buildings and equipment of the Nebraska Normal College, a private institution founded by Professor James M. Pile in 1891 and operated under his direction until his death in 1909. It opened as State Normal School in September, 1910, with Dr. U. S. Conn as president.

In 1921, by act of the State Legislature, the school became a State Normal School and Teachers College with legal authority to grant baccalaureate degrees in education. In 1949 the legislature changed the name of the institution to Nebraska State Teachers College at Wayne and granted the authority to confer the baccalaureate degree for study in liberal arts. The graduate program leading to a Master's degree was authorized in 1955; and in 1963 the legislature changed the name of the college to WAYNE STATE COLLEGE.

THE CAMPUS




### CONNELL HALL

Connell Hall, which for many years served as the campus student union, was remodeled in 1963 and contains the offices and classrooms for the Divisions of Business and Social Sciences. The office of the Director of Publications is also located in this building. The original wing of Connell Hall was built in 1923 and the center section and West Wing were completed in 1939. Faculty apartments are located on the second floor, and the Inter-Faith Chapel is located in the southwest wing of the first floor.




#### ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

The Administration Building, completed in 1915, contains the administration offices, a large auditorium-classroom, and general classrooms. The offices of the President, Deans, Registrar, Director of Graduate Studies, Director of Special Services, Director of Admissions, and the IBM center are located in this building.



### U. S. CONN LIBRARY

The U. S. Conn Library opened in 1956 and incorporates in its design the latest organizations and arrangements, together with library science facilities, curriculum laboratory, audio-visual laboratory, and instructional materials center. The John G. Neihardt Reading Room is located on the first floor of the Library. The library collection is made up of 76,071 volumes. Microfilm materials total 10,504 units. A major addition to the library, now under construction, will house expanded library facilities and electronic learning equipment.



### STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center opened in 1962 and students living in campus residence halls take their meals in the dining facilities of the building. The Center has two large student dining rooms with a total capacity of about 1000. In addition, there are two small banquet rooms, the Birch Room and the Walnut Room, accommodation in these total about 150. On the ground floor there is a large student grill, recreation room, the college book store, and the offices of student organizations. The attractive mezzanine of the Student Center serves as a campus reception hall for many events. The capacity of the building was increased by one-third with a major addition made in 1965. The office of the Coordinator of Student Activities is located on the ground level of the Center. Student social functions, including dances, are held in the Student Center.



#### HAHN BUILDING

The Hahn Building opened in 1926 and served as a laboratory school for teacher preparation. It now houses the Division of Languages on the main floors with a language laboratory and classrooms and offices for modern foreign languages on the top floor




### VAL PETERSON FINE ARTS CENTER

The Val Peterson Fine Arts Center opened in 1965. It houses the Division of Fine Arts. The Center includes the Lenore Ramsey Theater which seats about 850 persons. Also housed in the building are a smaller music recital hall, studios for FM radio broadcasts, art and music studios and classrooms, speech facilities, and the Wayne State Foundation art gallery. The foyer of the building serves as an art gallery.



### JOHN D. RICE HEALTH and PHYSICAL EDUCATION BUILDING

The John D. Rice Health and Physical Education Building, opened in the fall of 1958, is a handsome combination gymnasium and auditorium with some classroom facilities. To this building was added in 1965 a natatorium and medical dispensary. Housed in the Esther Dewitz Carlson Natatorium are a competition-size swimming pool, intramural playing floor, and medical facilities.



### ANDERSON HALL

Anderson Hall was erected in 1956 as a dormitory for women. The main floor provides lounging areas, a large reception area, recreation facilities, kitchens and laundries, and comfortable sleeping and study quarters.



### BOWEN HALL

The nine-story, high-rise Bowen Hall dormitory was completed in the fall of 1966. This facility houses 440 students, either men or women or both in separated sections. Bowen Hall is designed with student sleeping rooms built around a core that includes student lounges, study rooms, and small kitchens. The building is entirely air conditioned.



### MOREY HALL

Morey Hall, a residence for men, was completed in 1950. This hall is a three story structure located on the southeast corner of the campus. It has space for 235 men and provides lounges, recreation rooms, kitchen and laundry facilities.



### PILE HALL

J. M. Pile Hall, woman's residence hall, provides lounging areas for entertaining, large reception areas, recreation facilities, kitchens, and laundries, as well as comfortable sleeping and study quarters. This hall was named after the founder of the College, J. M. Pile.

## THE DIVISION OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The Department of Commerce, the predecessor of the present Department of Business, was established at Wayne in the year 1910, and J. M. Wiley served as its first department head. The Commerce Department offered courses in Penmanship, Commercial Law, Shorthand, Typing, and Book-keeping. A year later Accounting was added to the curriculum.

The Department of Commerce was changed to the Division of Business in 1958 and in 1964 was moved into Connell Hall, its present location.

At present there are 2577 students enrolled at Wayne State College, the Division of Business represents nearly one-fifth of this total. One-half of the Business students are acquiring degrees in the fields of Business Administration, the remainder are enrolled in either Secretarial Training, or Business Teacher Education.

The four degrees offered at Wayne State College in the Business field are Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts in Education, and Bachelor of Science in Education. These degrees are available in the fields of Accounting, General Business Administration, Finance, Marketing, and Secretarial Training.

The Division of Business at Wayne State makes a conscientious effort to keep astride of the changing business world. It works closely with the College Placement Bureau in order to channel its graduates into the areas of greatest opportunity. The Business Division also cooperates with the Student Senate and the entire business community.

Mrs. Baker received her B. S. in Education from Peru State College at Peru, Nebraska and her M. A. from the University of Nebraska.

Her experience before coming to Wayne State College included: teaching at the high school level at Denton, Kansas, Assistant Sportswear Buyer at Hoveland-Swanson at Lincoln, Nebraska, and Professor of Business at Tarkio College, Tarkio, Missouri.
