We, the brothers of Beta Alpha Mu, a professional business fraternity at Northeast Missouri State University, submit for your consideration this petition for acceptance.



HISTORY
OF
NORTHEAST MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

Northeast Missouri State University can trace its beginnings back to 1867, when Joseph Baldwin opened the Missouri Normal School and Commercial College. In 1870, the name was changed to First District Normal School-- the first Missouri supported institution for teacher preparation and the first such institution west of the Mississippi. This teacher education function was given formal recognition in 1919, when the name was changed to Northeast Missouri State Teachers College.


In recent years, the school has broadened its academic programs. In 1967, the "Teachers" was eliminated from the school name; in 1972, the series of name changes culminated in Northeast Missouri State University.


Northeast Missouri State University is located in Kirksville, Missouri. Kirksville, with a population of about 16,000, is primarily an agricultural community with several light industries present. In addition to being the home of the University, it is also the location of Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine, the first institution of its kind in the world. The student population is mostly from Missouri, but draws a large number of people from nearby Iowa and Illinois. Altogether, there are 5,500 students, including people from 36 states and 23 foreign countries.

The fourteen divisions include Business, Education, Fine Arts, Health and Physical Education, Home Economics, Language and Literature, Libraries and Museums, Mathematics, Military Science, Nursing, Practical Arts, Science, Social Science, and Special Programs. Currently, education has the highest enrollment, followed closely by business. In addition, there are numerous certificate programs

requiring one or two years of study. Totally, the University offers more than 100 degrees and certificate programs.

The University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, as well as by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.






HISTORY OF THE
DIVISION OF BUSINESS


The institution dates back to 1867 when Joseph Baldwin founded a private school which he named the North Missouri Normal School and Commercial College. There were courses in shorthand, bookkeeping, penmanship, and business law. The school became a state college in 1870 under the name of the North Missouri Normal School but the business courses continued even though "commercial college" disappeared from the school's name. There was a decline in the business courses and by 1900 they had disappeared. The name of the school progressed to First District Normal School, then to the Northeast Missouri State Teachers College in 1919, to Northeast Missouri State College in 1967, and to Northeast Missouri State University in 1972.

A commercial department was started in 1908 under Professor Mark Burrows who taught bookkeeping in the front of the room and typewriting in the back of the same room. He was succeeded in 1916 by his pupil, Paul O. Selby, who continued with the department until 1954. He was succeeded by Charles E. Kauzlarich who retired in 1976 and left the management to Robert Dager. The name of the division was changed from Commercial to Commerce to Business Education to Business. The size of the faculty increased until it now numbers 30 and the number of majors now 1121.

The work of the division has expanded so that it now includes work for bachelor's degrees in business education, business administration and accounting. A master's degree is offered in business education and there are one and two year courses in secretarial work, clerical, medical secretarial and accounting and data processing.

This university has Alpha Chapter of Pi Omega Pi, which is a national honorary fraternity in business education. The students in business also have the Accounting Club, Business Administration Club, the Free Enterprise Institute, Phi Beta Lambda, Zeta Beta and soon Delta Sigma Pi.

HISTORY
OF
BETA ALPHA MU

The possibility of organizing a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi at Northeast Missouri State University surfaced in April, 1978. It was the hope of approximately fifteen student coordinators and a Delta Sigma Pi alumni, William Holper, to get Beta Alpha Mu chartered as a chapter of Delta Sigma Pi in the fall of 1978. Officers were elected to get the gears of progress started right away so all would be full speed ahead in the fall. The officers elected were: President, Terri Zikes; Senior Vice-President, Russell Wray; Secretary, Sheri Baze; Treasurer, Mike Waldrop and Chancellor, Dan Ripley. The remaining offices would be filled in the fall.

The officers made plans to get more students aware of the newly forming professional fraternity. At preregistration, tables were set up. Names of interested students were obtained and at the same time these students were informed about the April 17th meeting. Students left school last spring with hopes of a rewarding and enjoyable future as members of Delta Sigma Pi at NMSU.

Posters were made August 25th at the home of William Holper. These posters were used in Violette Hall and at the registration table August 28-31. There were approximately seventy students who showed an interest in membership. During this same time officers and other students spoke in beginning business classes and at the Business Administration Club meeting to recruit members.

The informative posters, sign-up tables and speeches proved to be effective, because on August 31st sixty-one students attended the fall's first information meeting of Delta Sigma Pi. Meetings were then scheduled for each Monday night until initiation. Standing committees were formed September 11th. Each potential member chose at least one committee to participate in activities. Committees are as follows: Professional, By-Laws and Charter, Social, Public Relations, Fund Raising and Cystic-Fibrosis--Bike-a-thon.

On September 18th Mike Tillar (from Central Office) was at NMSU to explain Delta Sigma Pi goals and policies and to meet with officers and members. Everybody enjoyed meeting Mike and became excited about becoming a part of the fraternity and part of history making at NMSU.

The first money making project of Beta Alpha Mu was a car wash September 30th. In an aim to attract as many customers as possible, two locations were secured (Pamida and Sonic). Prices charged were: \$1 for a wash and \$2.50 for a wax job. Our work on this sunny cool day brought us proceeds of \$33.50. After the car wash we had our first party. A picnic style dinner was served after which some of those attending played volleyball.

Northeast Missouri State University's homecoming was October 13th and the 14th. Delta Sigma Pi entered a car in the parade. The car decorated with posters and streamers and filled with six Delta Sigs made its' way down the parade route. Young parade watchers enjoyed candy which was thrown into the crowded streets. On the same day a Toosie Roll drive sponsored by the Knights of Columbus was a success due to the help of Beta Alpha Mu. Tootsie Rolls were distributed during the parade and before the football game. Donations went to help mentally retarded children.

Three more officers were elected to round out the slate of officers. They were: Dick See, Vice-President of Pledge Education; Debby Hultz, Vice-President of Professional Activities and Sue Hobbs, Chapter Efficiency Index Chairman. The professional committee has a schedule of speakers finalized for the entire 1978-79 year. Two members of the Free Enterprise Institute of NMSU spoke about the Institute and the free enterprise system at the October 16th meeting. On November 20th Doug Kollar a CPA presented a talk at that professional meeting.

Many hours were spent planning the Cystic Fibrosis Bike-a-thon. Prizes were obtained from Kirksville merchants. Publicity for the event was excellent.

Ads in the Kirksville Daily Express, Kirksville Crier and the Index (campus newspaper) informed the community about the upcoming bike-a-thon. Also, KIRX and KRXL (Kirksville radio stations) announced it to the entire area of northeast Missouri and southeastern Iowa. Tables were set up in Violette Hall and the Student Union to handout pledge sheets. Students at the High School of Kirksville, Kirksville Junior High, and Mary Immaculate Grade School were urged to participate.

October 28th proved to be a perfect day for a bike-a-thon. Fifty-four riders participated. The route was $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, situated around the NMSU campus. Riders who stayed all day and rode over seventy miles were frequent. Riders also enjoyed a free lunch served at Red Barn Park.

The rider with the most pledges collected won a ten speed bike. Over seventy dollars was given for second place, third and fourth places. Everyone who rode received a prize or gift certificate. In addition, the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation provided a T-shirt for pledges of \$25 and a back pack for pledges of \$40 or more. Twenty-five hundred dollars in pledges was raised for Cystic Fibrosis. Prizes were awarded November 11th at the Student Union Building.

So that a steady weekly income could be earned, donuts and coffee were sold each Thursday and Friday morning in Violette Hall. Each member takes his turn selling donuts and coffee.

The first pledge season for Beta Alpha Mu officially started with the ceremony October 23rd. William Holper, Pat Ellebracht and R. S. Raymond (alumni members of Delta Sigma Pi) conducted the ceremony. This pledge class has worked very hard to make Beta Alpha Mu worthy of becoming part of the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity. Although much has been accomplished, the best is yet to come.
