

The Past

The San Diego State University was founded in 1897 as a teaching school for elementary school teachers. In 1911 it was recognized as a four-year State Teachers' College and in 1923 it became San Diego State College to reflect the growth in enrollment. The college teacher had long been a leader in the west and in 1929, this time to California State University, San Diego was given a four-campus, by about the time that was changed to San Diego State College.

The present location established in 1931, is a 275 acre campus located on the north side above Mission Valley and far from the 100 year old San Diego College, California's first state university. The school original campus buildings had a strong resemblance to typical California schools with their open-sided bell towers, arched windows and covered patios. Recent campus additions retain elements of the original style but add a modern, mid-century appearance.

Eighty-five percent of the 1,400 professors on the present faculty teach in one of the 120 departments in their disciplines.

Undergraduate degrees include Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music, or Bachelor of Southern Education in over 72 fields.

The Graduate School was founded in 1929 and awards a Master of

 San Diego State University was founded March 13, 1897 as a training school for elementary school teachers. In 1921 it was reorganized into a four-year State Teachers' College and in 1935 it became San Diego State College to reflect the growth in curriculum from strictly teacher training. Again in 1971 the name was changed, this time to California State University, San Diego and after a long campaign by alumni the final name change to San Diego State University was approved in 1973.

The present location established in 1931, is a 275 acre campus located on the south mesa above Mission Valley not far from the 208 year old San Diego de Alcala, California's first mission. The seven original campus buildings bear a strong resemblance to typical California missions with their open-faced bell towers, arches and covered passages. Recent campus additions retain elements of the mission style but add a modern, multi-story appearance.

Eighty-three percent of the 1,900 professors on the permanent teaching faculty hold doctorates in their discipline.

Undergraduate degrees include Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music, or Bachelor of Vocational Education in some 72 fields.

The Graduate School was founded in 1949 and awards a Master of

Arts and Master of Science degree in over 50 fields. Two-year programs are available for Master of Business Administration, Master of City Planning and Social Work. Doctoral degrees in Chemistry, Ecology and Genetics are awarded jointly with the University of California.

As one of the 19 Universities in the Californis State University and College System, San Diego State University adds an enrollment of 29,000 to the system total of 304,000 students.

San Diego State University's schools and colleges include, the College of Business Administration, College of Arts and Letters, College of Education, College of Engineering, College of Professional Studies, College of Sciences, and the School of Social Work.

Also offered are full year credit studies on university campuses in 12 foreign countries.

Campus radio, KPBS FM and television, KPBS TV stations serve San Diego County.

Over 200 student organizations are established on campus including Phi Beta Kappa established in 1974, 14 national social fraternities and 10 national social sororities.

Mascot: Aztec

Athletics: Member Western Athletic Conference (WAC)

Accreditation: Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

The College of Business Administration at San Diego State University had its beginning with the establishment in 1921 of the Department of Commerce. In 1935 the first A. B. degree in Liberal Arts with a major in Commerce was granted. The first separation in listing Commerce and Economics classes came in 1946 and in 1951 it became the Division of Business. The name again changed to the Division of Business Administration in 1955, in 1958 application was submitted for accreditation to the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business and subsequently was granted. The name again was changed to the School of Business Administration and recently again to its current designation, The College of Business Administration.

The ideological beginning of Delta Sigma Pi at San Diego State University dates at least as early as 1958 to an accreditation report prepared by the faculty and administration of the Division of Business. (APPENDIX A).

Its recent beginnings were at the Intermountain Regional Conference hosted by Gamma Omega in October, 1978 when the possibility of a chapter at San Diego State was discussed between several alumni and Grand President Bill Tatum. Later that month Bill Tatum visited Dean Hungate to insure his support. He was enthusiastically received and plans for a spring semester rush were made. Several weeks later Dean Hungate was again visited this time by Executive Director Ben Wolferberger. Again, the Dean insured his desire and support of a Delta Sigma Pi chapter at San Diego State University.

Preparations for a rush table began with the posting of signs furnished by the Central Office and courtesy of Gamma Omega chapter and Carl Brown. On Tuesday February 13th and Wednesday February 14th the table was set up and manned by Grand President Bill Tatum and Gamma Omega alumni Greg Kasun. Over sixty interested students signed up. An introductory meeting held on Wednesday February 14th with a smaller than anticipated number in attendance. Plans were made for a follow up meeting and it was held on February 25th.

Although the attendance at this meeting was again small, this group took the initiative to plan a second rush table and rush function, organize a setting, and get campus wide advertising. (Appendix A). The event a "kegger" party with beer supplied by area alumni was a success and over 40 students attended and plans were made for a fourth meeting. This meeting resulted in the election of officers:

Committees were established and possible projects were discussed. Plans for future meetings to be held at Aztec Center on Sunday evenings at 5:30 pm were made and committees sent out to investigate their projects.

As meetings continued chapter projects were determined to be:

Financial - SDSU College of Business T-shirt sale. The sale has just been completed, over 250 sold, and distribution of shirts ordered is scheduled for the week of April 16-19.

Service - The repair and clean-up of the Child Care center on campus adjacent to the College of Business.

Professional - A tour of Bernardo Winery in Rancho Bernardo is scheduled, a tour of Pacific Southwest Airlines is pending, and contact has been made for a speaker from local business.

Social - An Installation Banquet at the Atlantis Restaurant.

Papers are on file for the granting of on campus status for the organization. (Appendix A).

The Present

The College of Business Administration, headed by Dean Robert H. Huggins is located on the third and fourth floors of the Business Administration/Innovation building on the east side of campus. It is divided into six departments:

School of Accountancy with 15 full and part-time instructors

Finance Department with 14 full and part-time instructors

Information Systems Department with 17 full and part-time instructors

Management Department with 12 full and part-time instructors

Marketing Department with 10 full and part-time instructors

The Present

Currently there are 15 Colleges of Business Administration based on campuses headed by the Associated Business Students Council.

Total undergraduate enrollment for the fall semester of 1973 was 1,000 students. 2,300 were Pre-Business majors, and enrollment was designated Pre-Business majors also entrance in a professional program is limited to approximately 900 Accounting majors, 600 Management majors, Marketing-400 majors, Finance-500 majors, 100 majors in Information Systems, 110 in Real Estate, and 20 Information majors.

The University operates on a semester system. Fall semester classes begin in early September and end in late December. Spring classes start in late January in early May.

The College of Business Administration headed by Dean Robert P. Hungate is located on the third and fourth floors of the Business Administration/Mathematics building on the far east side of campus.

It is divided into six departments:

School of Accountancy with 38 full and part-time instructors

Finance Department with 41 full and part-time instructors

Information Systems Department with 27 full and part-time instructors

Management Department with 36 full and part-time instructors

Marketing Department with 28 full and part-time instructors

Currently there are 15 College of Business Administration based organizations headed by the Associated Business Students Council.

Total undergraduate enrollment for the fall semester of 1978 was 5,026 students. 2,346 were Pre-Business majors, underclassmen are designated Pre-Business majors since entrance to a professional program is limited to upperclassmen, 954 Accounting majors, 659 Management majors, Marketing-444 majors, Finance-335 majors, 146 majors in Information Systems, 116 in Real Estate, and 26 Insurance majors.

The University operates on a semester system. Fall semester classes begin in early September and end in late December, Spring classes meet from late January to early May.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be DELTA SIGMA PI

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to foster the study of business in universities; to encourage scholarship, social activity and the association of students for their mutual advancement by research and practice; to promote closer affiliation between the commercial world and students, and to further a higher standard of commercial ethics and culture and civic and commercial welfare of the community.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership in this organization shall be open to those students of San Diego State University who are in the academic fields of business, commerce or economics and have complete 12 semester hours or more with a cum 2.0 GPA.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be Pres., V.P., Secretary, Treasurer and Historian. (specify other offices).

Section 2. To be eligible for office, candidates shall be students who meet section 1 requirements and are in good standing ie owing no due or other expenses or services


