

In 1908, one year after Oklahoma became a state, Cameron State School of Agriculture named for the Rev. E. D. Cameron, a Baptist minister and Oklahoma's first State Superintendent of Schools. The first classes held on Statehood Day, November 16, 1909, in the basement of a bank building while a new campus building was constructed.

Cameron added junior college work in 1927. With this changed function came a new name — Cameron State Agricultural College. In 1941, high school courses were dropped, and Cameron became solely a junior college.

The Oklahoma State Regents authorized baccalaureate degrees in 1966 for Higher Education, following action by the Legislature. The institution's name shortened to Cameron College in 1971, and then changed to Cameron University in 1974.

In 1988, State Regents expanded Cameron's functions to include offerings at the master's degree level. This change in function was the first granted to an Oklahoma institution since Cameron was given the authority to offer bachelor's degrees more than 20 years earlier. In May 2004, the Duncan Higher Education Center in Duncan, Oklahoma, became an official branch campus and was renamed Cameron University - Duncan.

Today, Cameron is known as the "University of Choice" and serves students from around the world. Offering more than 50 degrees through two-year, four-year and graduate programs, Cameron is the only public university in Oklahoma that offers associate, bachelor's and master's degree programs at one site.

Cameron University is committed to providing its students a top quality education with caring and qualified faculty. Small class sizes provide an environment where learning and student success are the highest priority. Cameron offers an honors program, early admission, advanced standing, a study abroad program, and college-level examination programs. Free tutoring is available in labs across campus to assist students in achieving academic success.




School of Business History



The School of Business Building opened its doors to students for the first time in August 2009 with a formal dedication in November. The building was a cornerstone project using \$7.8 million of the \$13.7 million allocated to Cameron University from the 2005 Promise of Excellence Higher Education Bond Issue and \$500,000 in Cameron University funds. The building firmly established Cameron's architectural palette of "Cameron blend brick," pitched roof and striking visual elements. It's more than 32,000 gross square feet with a 114-seat auditorium, state-of-the-art computer and accounting labs, and a finance lab with a real-time stock ticker. The School of Business has multiple interaction areas for students, faculty, and visitors as well as a career center with practice interview areas. The Cameron University School of Business Building was re-named Cynthia S. Ross Hall, following approval by the University of Oklahoma, Cameron University and Rogers State University Board of Regents. Regent Richard R. Dunning, Chairman, requested the name change in recognition of the extraordinary contributions made by Cameron President Cindy Ross over her 11 years of service to the University.

Alpha Eta Omega Colony History

February 29, 2012, Cory Stopka, Jerry Hotwagner, Avery Moore, Mark Wernette and Megan Ray presented information on Delta Sigma Pi for business students at Cameron University. Hearing what Delta Sigma Pi had to offer the Cameron University School of Business students were eager to sign a letter of intent. More than 20 students began to establish the Alpha Eta Omega Colony.

Dr. Roxanne Gooch, a professor and Brother was instrumental in the development of the colony. Waheed Gbadamosi was elected as the first President of Alpha Eta Omega. In the beginning, colony members were filling multiple executive roles and working diligently to expand the colony. During this process, the colony members became more than students with a common goal of bettering themselves and the school, they became Brothers.

Networking and brotherhood are instrumental within Delta Sigma Pi. Along with Brothers in surrounding areas, Alpha Eta Omega colony members are able to rely on the bond of brotherhood to help in all areas of school, business, and colony expansion. Epsilon Zeta was a key part in welcoming the Alpha Eta Omega colony to the region and along with their guidance and leadership helped shape the colony into what we are today.

As some of the original members began to graduate and new recruits were coming in and taking on executive responsibilities the colony began to flourish. An individual member now handled an executive role and tasks were completed in a timelier manner. The organizational structure of the colony was truly taking shape. As the fall of 2013 came around, a large informational was held and recruitment soared. As the colony grew so did the bonding of its Brothers.

With more and more members attending fraternity events throughout the states, the knowledge within the colony was expanding greatly. Each event empowered colony members with the ability to improve themselves and the Brothers around them. Due to contacts made through Delta Sigma Pi colony members were able to find jobs, were offered positions within the community, and were presented with multiple leadership opportunities. Continued improvement of the colony structure and quality of recruits fulfilled the requirements to submit a petition and charter.

Thanks to the hard work of all the Brothers in the colony, a petition was forged and all the members have taken one-step closer to becoming official Brothers of Delta Sigma Pi.

We closed the fall 2013 semester with a Christmas party at Samurai Japanese Cuisine Sushi Bar & Hibachi.




Male to Female Ratio Colony Members
