



Drexel University was founded in 1891 by Anthony J. Drexel, or AJ Drexel for short, a noted financier and philanthropist. Hailing from the famous Drexel family, AJ Drexel wanted to use his finances to open an institute with the mission to provide practical arts and science educational opportunities for both men and women in Philadelphia. Originally called the Drexel Institute of Technology, it gained its university status in 1970, becoming the #102 nationally ranked university.


As of 2015, more than 26,000 students are enrolled in over 70 undergraduate programs and more than 100 master's, doctoral, and professional programs at the university. Drexel's cooperative education program (co-op) is a unique aspect of the school's degree programs, offering students the opportunity to gain up to 18 months of paid, full-time work experience in a field relevant to their undergraduate major or graduate degree program prior to graduation. There is the five year three co-op option as well as the four year one co-op option. Most students choose to attend Drexel University due to this amazing co-op program.

Through all of the changes and evolution, Drexel's core mission has held constant. Since its founding, the institution has remained a coeducational center of higher learning, distinguished by a commitment to preparing men and women for success in their chosen careers. Accounting:

An exploration of accounting can lead to a deeper understanding of applied and social sciences, marketing and business communication, as well as finance, business law and management information systems.

Business Analytics:

Studies in business analytics include coursework in statistics, operations research, management information systems, econometrics and modeling through the Business Analytics program in the Decision Sciences and MIS department.

Business and Engineering:

Complete a set of broad business core courses along with a firm foundation in science, mathematics and engineering. You will also have the opportunity to study the areas of operations management, technology innovation management, finance and marketing, as well as the functional areas of engineering from Drexel's College of Engineering.

Economics:

Offered through the Decision Sciences and MIS department, courses in this program are ideal for students who want to learn how to manage people and the systems related to information technology.

Marketing:

The marketing course selection is for students who are interested in demographics, research, advertising, branding and related fields. The recommended plan of study includes classes in communications, society and culture and finance, in addition to fine arts, business consulting, management simulation and more.

Organizational Management:

The Organizational Management program at Drexel LeBow prepares students with the skills necessary to be successful in their careers, including communication, integrity, teamwork, cross-cultural sensitivity, negotiation, leadership and vision.

Sport Management:



DEVELOPMENT OF DREXEL UNIVERSITY COLONY

DESCRIPTION OF DREXEL UNIVERSITY COLONY EVENTS

What is Delta Sigma Pi

We held a recruitment event where we informed potential brothers about the history of Delta Sigma Pi and where this organization originated from. We answered any and all questions students had about DSP. After this professional event, the students gained a better understanding of what Delta Sigma Pi's mission, benefits, events, networking opportunities, etc.

Finals Care Package Fundraiser

For a fundraising event, we made care packages with snacks such as cookies, candy, and mini chip bags to help students get through finals week. People could pre-order or stop by our table and buy care packages for themselves or their friends. It was a great customized gift for people to take.

Resume Workshop

For this workshop, we had people bring in their resumes so we could give them constructive criticism and help them enhance their resumes. This event was hosted with staff members from our Undergraduate Business Advising department. We went over the basic components needed in a resume and showed examples of different formatting structures. We answered any questions people had and by the end of it, people walked out more confidence in their resumes.

Senior Day Care Trip

We went to the Philadelphia Senior Center and helped serve food to the senior citizens. Our colony members also created gift baskets with everyday items as well as letters to help the seniors have something to read when they feel alone. We ate lunch with them and took them out to a park near the care center. The elders said that it was great to hangout with us and feel "young" again by walking outside and seeing dogs run and jump around us.

MANNA

MANNA is an organization that uses nutrition to improve health for people with serious illnesses who need nourishment to heal. Our colony volunteered and assisted the staff in the kitchen by chopping vegetables, cooking and baking, prepping and packaging, delivering meals to clients, and providing assistance with general office work.

Kiwi Fundraiser

Another fundraising event took place at Kiwi, a frozen yogurt place near campus. On this day, we received fifteen percent of each sale as long as people mentioned Delta Sigma Pi to the cashier or showed our flyer. Even though this was a fundraising event, it was another great opportunity for brothers to spend time together and bond. We also were able to bring a few new interested students to give them a chance to better know our members.

Co-op Panel

We had a co-op panel comprised of students who had already completed a co-op cycle as well as co-op advisors to inform the audience about their experiences and to give any advice. Some students talked about their co-ops abroad and it really intrigued some people as many people weren't aware of this program until then. In addition, students gave tips and tricks that they figured out throughout applying and interviewing. For example, brothers mentioned it was helpful to ask questions and then send thank you emails after interviews to show interest and stand out.

Bubble Tea Fundraiser

We all bonded together while enjoying some bubble tea. The morning of, our brothers woke up early to make Oolong Tea, Thai Tea, and Strawberry Lemonade drinks. To make our bubble tea fundraiser unique and stand out, we served the drinks in light bulb shaped cups. We held this event in the business school lobby as it is a high traffic area throughout the day and non-business students come in for Starbucks as well.

Cigna Open House

One of our brothers completed her co-op at Cigna and thought it would be a good idea to host a company open house to inform students about the internship and full time opportunities at the firm. Our colony worked with the HR department as well as Lebow Undergraduate Advising department to organize and market this event. It was great to have a panel of speakers from Drexel co-ops to Cigna managers. Each department in the firm gave an explanation of what the department does, what type of opportunities there are within, and what type of candidates they're looking for. Everyone was able to leave with many free swag bag goodies too!

Accounting Networking Day

As co-op and job applying are important aspects at Drexel, we teamed up with the Lebow

Business School and attended an Accounting Networking Day event. There were recruiters from various firms, including PwC, BDO, CitrinCooperman, Andersen Tax, Drucker & Scaccetti, Novogradac & Company, KPMG, Vanguard, Grant Thornton, Comcast, Johnson and Johnson, and Bowman & Company LLP. It was great to gain insider info and learn about job opportunities that were geared specifically to Drexel students. Our members were able to speak to recruiters one to one and hand in resumes.

Out of the Darkness Walk

This service event was for Out of the Darkness Walks, which is a walk to raise awareness and funds that allow the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) to invest in new research, create educational programs, advocate for public policy, and support survivors of suicide loss. As volunteers, we helped with a variety of tasks, including: participant check-in, set-up and breakdown, participant and traffic control, serving breakfast, and more.

Boo at the Zoo

For this service event, we went to the Philadelphia Zoo and helped with candy distribution and Halloween-themed crafts and games for little kids. Our brothers dressed up for the Halloween spirit and walked groups of students around a tour where the kids could learn about animal extinction for the "spooky" holiday. There were other activities of pumpkin painting and maze walking as well.

Johnson & Johnson Day

On this day, we were able to leave the classroom and get a look into the business industry and a daily routine of a Johnson & Johnson employee. We had a tour of the J&J office (New Brunswick) and were given a presentation about the company's history, current efforts and work environment. This professional event was a great help to those looking into working for Johnson & Johnson in the future because of the connections that were made this day.

Dodgeball Tournament

As one of our fundraising events, we hosted a dodgeball tournament on campus that consisted of 10 teams, each with 5 members. To enter, teams had to register before our tournament and pay \$20 to participate to win. At this event, we packed the armory with friends and family to cheer on the contestants. This event was open to the public.
