### The History of Clark Atlanta University

Clark Atlanta University (CAU) holds a unique place in the landscape of higher education, emerging from the consolidation of two esteemed institutions with deep roots in African American education: Atlanta University and Clark College. This merger took place in 1988, but the story begins much earlier.

Atlanta University traces its origins back to 1865 when it was founded by the American Missionary Association, with support from the Freedmen's Bureau. It quickly became a beacon of education for African Americans, granting graduate degrees and supplying teachers across the South. Over time, it expanded its offerings to include liberal arts and professional programs, solidifying its position as a leader in African American education.

Clark College, on the other hand, was established in 1869 by the Freedmen's Aid Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, later known as the United Methodist Church. Named after Bishop Davis W. Clark, the college aimed to provide education to freedmen and soon became a cornerstone of Methodist education for African Americans.

Throughout the years, both institutions flourished, each making significant contributions to African American education and society at large. In the 1930s, recognizing the benefits of collaboration, Clark College joined the Atlanta University Complex, laying the groundwork for future partnerships.

The pivotal moment came in 1988 when Atlanta University and Clark College boards made the historic decision to consolidate, forming Clark Atlanta University. This bold move preserved the rich traditions and legacies of both institutions while charting a new path forward.

Dr. Thomas W. Cole, Jr. became the first president of Clark Atlanta University, leading the institution into a new era of growth and innovation. The consolidation created a dynamic university that inherited the strengths and values of its predecessors, setting the stage for continued excellence in education and community engagement.

Today, Clark Atlanta University stands as a testament to the enduring legacy of African American education and the power of collaboration. As part of the Atlanta University Center Consortium, alongside esteemed partners like Morehouse College and Spelman College, CAU continues to uphold its mission of academic excellence and social responsibility.

### Clark Atlanta University Current Enrollment Statistics 2023-24

Total full-time teaching faculty number = 190, 90% of whom hold terminal degrees; 56% have tenure status.

Faculty-student ratio is 1:16.

During the 2022-23 academic year, the University awarded a total of 633 degrees (452 Bachelor's; 145 Master's; 36 Doctorates). The retention rate for the Fall 2022 first-time, freshmen returning for a second year is 68%, and the six-year graduation rate for those entering in Fall 2017 is 48%. Our graduates are deeply employed in the sectors such as business, film, and media, medical and healthcare, and government.

Fall 2023 Headcount Enrollment = 4135 (3495 Undergraduate; 640 Graduate). Total Full-time Equivalent (FTE) = 3939.

Georgia students constitute 33% of total enrollment, 66% of students come from out-of-state and 1% represent Saudi Arabia and 10 other foreign countries. Female students constitute 76% of the total enrollment while male students comprise of 24%.

Currently there are six university own; two university managed; and three university leased residential facilities to house approximately 2300 students. There are more than 45 chartered student organizations including social fraternities and sororities.

### **Clark Atlanta University School of Business**

In the academic year of 2021-22, the Clark Atlanta University School of Business (CAUSB) commemorated its 75th Anniversary with a year-long "Reflecting Forward' celebration. Throughout the festivities, we orchestrated a variety of events to honor our rich history, enhance our current standing, and chart a course for the future.

With a robust alumni network comprising over 10,000 business administration and 3,000 MBA graduates, our former students have excelled across diverse sectors including corporate, educational, entrepreneurial, and public service domains. We are committed to building upon this impressive legacy.

For seven decades, the School of Business has been synonymous with excellence in education, attracting students from over 40 states and 30 countries. Notably, we pride ourselves on maintaining one of the largest cohorts of African American business students.

Our overarching mission is to propel management education forward, cultivating the next generation of leaders while striving to establish ourselves as a premier business school consistently ranked among the "Top 25" of Business Schools. The support of the organization remains instrumental as we continue our journey towards excellence, honoring tradition while embracing a new era of achievements.

The CAUSB MBA is ranked # 9 on the best MBA programs in Georgia. Georgia is home to many stellar MBA degree programs. These programs represent many different approaches to business education with one to suit nearly any student.

On Friday, September 15th, 2023, students from the Clark Atlanta University MBA program won the highly competitive business case competition held at the National Black MBA Association Case Competition. During the competition, students solve a challenging business case and compete for \$50,000 in scholarships. This year, 20 top MBA programs competed. The CAU team earned their way to the finals to compete against Vanderbilt, Auburn, Morgan State University, and Rutgers. The CAU team took 1st place, Vanderbilt was 2nd place, and Auburn earned 3rd place.

Clark Atlanta University's School of Business was recently selected as the 2023 National Black MBA Association's (NBMBAA) Collegiate Partner of the Year. This award is given yearly to higher-education institutions that provide exemplary academic efforts to increase awareness and opportunities for business administration students and members. The award was presented at the NBMBAA Conference in Philadelphia on September 16, 2023.

### Clark Atlanta University School of Business Majors

### **Accounting**

The School of Business at Clark Atlanta University confers:

- the Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration with a concentration in accounting,
- the Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration with a dual concentration in Accounting and Finance,
- and the Bachelor of Arts degree in Accounting.

Graduating students in Business Administration are prepared to pursue advanced studies at the graduate level or professional careers in business. Graduating students with a major in accounting obtain a practical and theoretical knowledge of accounting through courses in accounting principles, auditing, accounting information systems, and income taxation. This wide range of course offerings prepares them for successful careers in public, private, and government accounting.

The Accounting Department also offers courses in Principles of Accounting and Managerial Accounting to all students majoring in business. Principles of Accounting courses are required by selected degree programs in other colleges at Clark Atlanta University.

### **Business Administration**

### **Economics**

The Department of Economics confers the Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics. The undergraduate economics curriculum prepares students for graduate studies as well as employment in government or private industry. Economics majors pursue studies designed to acquaint them with the theoretical foundations of modern economic analysis, analytical tools, and applications to contemporary issues.

### **Entrepreneurial Management**

Entrepreneurial Management (EM) has emerged within the past decades as an important focus for business students, academicians, and practitioners across the country. Entrepreneurial hopefuls require an appropriate course of study to prepare for an environment defined by change. Clark Atlanta University's EM program offers a uniquely tailored curriculum aligned with the traditional MBA curriculum, but also includes case studies of diverse entrepreneurs, innovation, and enterprise.

The program will provide the education and training in the basic core values and skills necessary to compete effectively as a business owner in today's economic environment, and to facilitate the development of a wealth-creating class

### **Finance & Financial Planning**

The finance curriculum is designed to provide students with the tools required for careers in financial management in non-financial corporations, the financial services industry, and not-for-profit organizations. The course offerings include required courses for all students enrolled in the School of Business and elective courses for students concentrating in the finance area, including courses in real estate and insurance. The finance department also has academic responsibility for the International Business concentration.

The course offerings are designed to equip students with the breadth of knowledge required to become effective financial analysts and managers in a rapidly changing economic and technological environment.

All undergraduate students in the Business School are required to take the Business Finance (CBUS 341) course as part of the general business core curriculum. In addition, business students with a concentration in finance must take an additional 18 credit hours in approved finance courses, consisting of 12 credit hours of required finance courses and 6 credit hours of approved finance electives.

Students with a concentration in International Business must take an additional 18 credit hours (beyond the business core courses) in approved international business courses, consisting of 9 credit hours of required international business courses and 9 credit hours of approved international business electives. Detailed course requirements for the International Business concentration requirements can be found on the International Business program page.

### **International Business**

At Clark Atlanta University's School of Business, the International Business program stands as a beacon of global business education. Designed for the next generation of business leaders, this innovative program offers a dual concentration approach, providing students with a comprehensive understanding of both domestic and international business landscapes.

Our curriculum is meticulously crafted, encompassing essential subjects such as International Business Management, International Financial Management, and International Marketing, along with a recommended international experience. This immersive program not only deepens students' global business acumen but also sharpens their leadership qualities, preparing them to thrive in a diverse and dynamic global market. ### **Management**

The Management Program of the Clark Atlanta University School of Business offers instruction in the forms of work that all managers must perform – planning, organizing, staffing, motivating, and controlling. The Department's objective is to provide students with the knowledge necessary for them to become effective managers in the private and public enterprise sectors. The courses listed below meet the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration and Accounting with a Management Concentration.

### **Marketing**

As the vital link between the customer and the whole firm, marketing helps guide the whole firm, marketing helps guide the selection of goods and services produced, the establishment and maintenance of effective and efficient means of distribution, the pricing process, and the promotion process, which includes advertising and sales. The objective is to join sound concepts and marketplace realities so that students will have strong preparation for rewarding marketing positions and the capacity for advancement in marketing organizations.

### **Master of Business Administration**

The master's in business administration (MBA) programs at Clark Atlanta University offer diverse concentrations and a tailored educational experience. The focus is on preparing students for managerial opportunities through sequential coursework and small class sizes with a low student-to-faculty ratio.

### **Sports and Entertainment Management**

The sports and entertainment industry has emerged as one of the leading occupational areas of the century. Both categories cross all social, religious, and language barriers. It has been estimated that over 5 million sport-related jobs are in existence today. Clark Atlanta University's Sports and Entertainment Management program combines theory and experiential learning to prepare graduates to assume managerial positions or create their own business enterprises serving these industries. Students engage with leading practitioners and talent to gain first-hand knowledge of what it means to work and succeed in these fields.

### **Supply Chain Management**

A concentration in Supply Chain Management provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the flow of goods and services from origin to consumer. The curriculum focuses on areas such as procurement, logistics, inventory management, operations and supply chain strategy. Students develop key skills such as analytical thinking, problem-solving, negotiations, project management and proficiency in supply chain and artificial intelligence technologies.

Supply chain management is crucial because it directly impacts a company's efficiency, customer satisfaction, competitiveness, ability to manage global operations, risk mitigation, innovation capacity, sustainability efforts, and collaborative success.

### **Development of Clark Atlanta Startup Group**

The journey of the Delta Sigma Pi Clark Atlanta Startup Group began at the Spring 2022 B School Business Expo, where Sasha Edwards crossed paths with Sierra Blackstone at a Delta Sigma Pi display table. Inspired by the vision of establishing a Startup Group, Sasha alongside fellow students Zavan Croom, Alexis Glenn, Navarro Butler, and Jasmin Brent, submitted a Letter of Intent. With the endorsement of Professor Gary O. Clement and Professor Clayvon Croom Jr., the group embarked on a mission to network and connect with industry professionals across Clark Atlanta University, Spelman College, and Morehouse College campuses.

During the Fall 2022 Semester, the Startup group made significant strides, attending the Delta Sigma Pi Atlanta Alumni annual picnic, participating in leadership and development training at Georgia State University, and expanding their membership within the School of Business. By the semester's end, the Delta Sigma Pi Startup Group earned official recognition as a campus-chartered organization from Clark Atlanta University. Engaging in community service activities, such as distributing food to the unhoused and food-insecure households, underscored their commitment to making a positive impact.

Spring 2023 brought further growth and success as Alumni Sheigo Carter joined as a faculty advisor. The group hosted multiple professional and community service events, including their debut at the Clark Atlanta organization fair. Support from Kennesaw State University and Georgia State University bolstered their efforts, while special guest speakers like Professor Danaita King enriched their professional events.

The Fall 2023 Semester saw continued expansion, with Professor Danaita King and Professor Gary O. Clement joining as faculty advisors. The Startup group received guidance from Growth Consultant Yiannoula Katsadas and celebrated the coronation of the first Mr. and Miss Delta Sigma Pi. Collaborating with various organizations, they hosted a successful fashion show fundraiser, showcasing the talent within the School of Business and raising funds for chartering fees.

As they entered the Spring 2024 Semester, the Startup group intensified recruitment efforts and gained recognition at the Spring Greek Symposium. With a growing membership and support from the Delta Sigma Pi Atlanta Alumni Chapter, they are poised to petition for chartering as the 4th HBCU chapter of Delta Sigma Pi, marking a significant milestone in their journey of growth and impact.
