HOW TO USE THIS LEGISLATION BOOKLET AT PROVINCIAL COUNCILS

This document describes in detail policy recommendations and a Bylaw amendment that has been proposed to the Northeastern Provincial Council for consideration.

Per Section O, Policy 12 of the National Fraternity Policies and Procedures, Provincial Councils establish the Regions and their boundaries within their respective Province. During years in which a Congress convenes following July 1, the Provincial Vice President will assume jurisdiction and leadership of the new region until a Regional Vice President is elected at Congress (or after). Provincial boundary changes are a Bylaw change and require a vote of the Grand Chapter if the Northeastern Province passes this proposal.

Ritual proposals from the Board of Directors are in a separate document.

- Bylaw amendments must achieve a 2/3 majority vote at Congress to pass.
 - > Any language with strikethroughs would be deleted if the proposal or amendment passes.
 - > Any language listed in **bold** indicates language that would be added if the amendment or proposal was adopted.
 - > Language in *italics* is included occasionally for explanatory purposes.

PROPOSALS

PROPOSAL 1 – Recommendation to the Northeastern Provincial Council

Submitted by:

Northeastern Provincial Boundary Task Force (Suzanne Swire, Amanda Romine, Victoria Beatty)

Summarization of the Proposal/Recommendation:

Proposes that the regional boundaries be redrawn in order to optimize the level of support that chapters receive from their elected leaders. The current number of regions remains the same, at six (6). Boundaries were redrawn to balance the chapters which must be supported by each Regional Vice President to conduct chapter visits (see Proposed Regions below). (Chapter names with asterisks indicate they have moved from another region -- see the legend at the end of this section.)

Purpose of the Proposal/Recommendation and reason(s) for its submission:

Recommended implementation date and logic for selecting this date

The Regional Boundary task force recommends that the proposed changes go into effect at the conclusion of the 47th Grand Chapter Congress in Washington D.C., so as to coincide with the installation of newly elected leadership. Nominations for office and elections for the next biennium would be to support the new regional structure.

Positive aspects of implementing Proposal/Recommendation

- The Provincial Vice President requested a review of chapter distribution within regions, and appointed a task force to perform the analysis and submit a recommendation to the Provincial Council
- The new regional boundaries will better take into account demographic similarities of chapters, as well as the historical center of gravity of volunteer leaders
- Geographic density as well as travel times were taken into account when proposing new regions

Negative aspects of implementing Proposal/Recommendation

- 2nd regional realignment in 4 years
- Perceived lack of stability in regions

Provide a brief cost analysis of the Proposal/Recommendation (if applicable)

Fraternity guides (Pledge manuals, etc) and the web site would need to be updated to represent these changes. Cost of web site changes is limited to the time it takes to implement the changes. The task force recommends that Fraternity publications not be reprinted on account of this change, but be modified at such a time as the next reprint.

PROPOSAL 2 – Bylaw Amendment

Requires 2/3 vote by GCC to pass.

Submitted by:

Northeastern Provincial Boundaries Task Force (Suzanne Swire, Chair; Amanda Romine; Victoria Beatty)

Summarization of the Proposal/Recommendation

To allow the entire Cincinnati Metropolitan area to be administered by one Province and one Region.

Article II, Section 11. parts a. and b. of the Bylaws now read:

- a. Northeastern Province -- To consist of the Collegiate and Alumni Chapters in the states of Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, the District of Columbia, Delaware, Ohio, West Virginia, northern Virginia (Iota Kappa and Mu Tau chapters and the Northern Virginia alumni chapter) and the provinces of New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Quebec and Ontario in Canada.
- **b. Southern Province** -- To consist of the Collegiate and Alumni Chapters in the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia (except Iota Kappa and Mu Tau chapters and the Northern Virginia alumni chapter).

Article II, Section 11. parts a. and b. of the Bylaws would read:

- a. Northeastern Province -- To consist of the Collegiate and Alumni Chapters in the states of Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, the District of Columbia, Delaware, Ohio, the Cincinnati metropolitan area counties located in Kentucky (Kenton, Campbell, and Boone), West Virginia, northern Virginia (Iota Kappa and Mu Tau chapters and the Northern Virginia alumni chapter) and the provinces of New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Quebec and Ontario in Canada.
- b. Southern Province -- To consist of the Collegiate and Alumni Chapters in the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky (except the Cincinnati metropolitan area counties Kenton, Campbell, and Boone), Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia (except Iota Kappa and Mu Tau chapters and the Northern Virginia alumni chapter).

Purpose of the Proposal/Recommendation and reason(s) for its submission (may not exceed 100 words if ultimately submitted for Grand Chapter consideration)

The schools on the Kentucky side of the Cincinnati area can be more easily served by East Central leadership due to their proximity and demographic similarities. This will affect possible expansion to Northern Kentucky University which is located 7 miles from Cincinnati, as well as

existing chapters in Cincinnati at University of Cincinnati and Xavier University. This will also allow alumni who live in Northern Kentucky to be eligible to run for RVP, while they were previously ineligible despite close proximity to several chapters.

Recommended implementation date and logic for selecting this date

During or immediately following Grand Chapter Congress, since no existing chapters' region or province will be changed.

Positive aspects of implementing Proposal/Recommendation

This will allow all chapters and alumni volunteers in the Cincinnati metropolitan area to be within one region and one province. This will generate a larger base for volunteers and will create more opportunities for expansion and regional events.

Negative aspects of implementing Proposal/Recommendation

Will require education and some editing in Fraternity publications.

Provide a brief cost analysis of the Proposal/Recommendation (if applicable)

There would be the cost of editing maps and Fraternity publications, though the Manuals for Pledge Education are reprinted each year.
